

# 2 Islanders Have Chance To Win Jackpot In Sweeps

DUBLIN (CP) — More than 600 Canadian tickets were drawn for the last 19th Sweepstakes of the year during two days of counting which ended last Friday night. Six Canadian draw tickets on Hidden Means, the 19th Sweepstakes, to be run at Newmarket, England, last Wednesday.

Five tickets were drawn on all 113 eligible horses, although more than half were withdrawn as entries and a smaller number will actually run. Canadian draw tickets on 111 of the eligible horses.

The six Canadians with tickets on the favorite, identified only by Name de Plume, listed as follows: Ontario, Victoria, B.C., Regina and Calgary.

Five Canadians drew tickets on the second favorite, Bewlston, last quoted at odds of 12 to 1. Five other Canadians were drawn for Golden Wedding, a third favorite, at 14 to 1.

A total of 521 Canadian tickets were drawn. Those whose horses were eliminated from the \$150,000 for a first-place finish.

# Rangers Rave About New Line

NEW YORK (AP)—"The best line on the ice," happily proclaimed Baltimore Red Sullivan, an ex-New York Ranger.

"They're going to give a lot of people a lot of trouble," predicted Ranger coach and general manager Muzz Patrick.

The objects of all the conversation was a new, young front line of Dave Balon, Jean Ratelle and Ed Gilbert, which made its debut as a unit in the Rangers' 2-1 National Hockey League loss to Detroit Thursday night.

As it turns out, they were about the only bright spot in the season's opening game for the Rangers. They got the only goal, just missed on two others, and a 1-1 rly dominated play, every time they were on the ice.

Rookie right wing Gilbert, as expected, was the big gun.

"This kid has all the moves, everything to be a really great hockey player," said Sullivan, who coached all three at Kitchener, a Ranger farm club, before he came to New York. "You can't say enough about him," said Emile Francis, now an assistant general manager on the Rangers, who coached Gilbert and Ratelle when they were Juniors at Guelph.

Gilbert, 21, was an immediate sensation when he was brought up as a replacement for an injured player last season during the Stanley Cup playoffs.

Ratelle, 22, and Balon, 20, played with the Rangers last season. Ratelle returning to the minors when he slumped in mid-season.
