draws to the satisfying conclusion

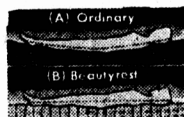

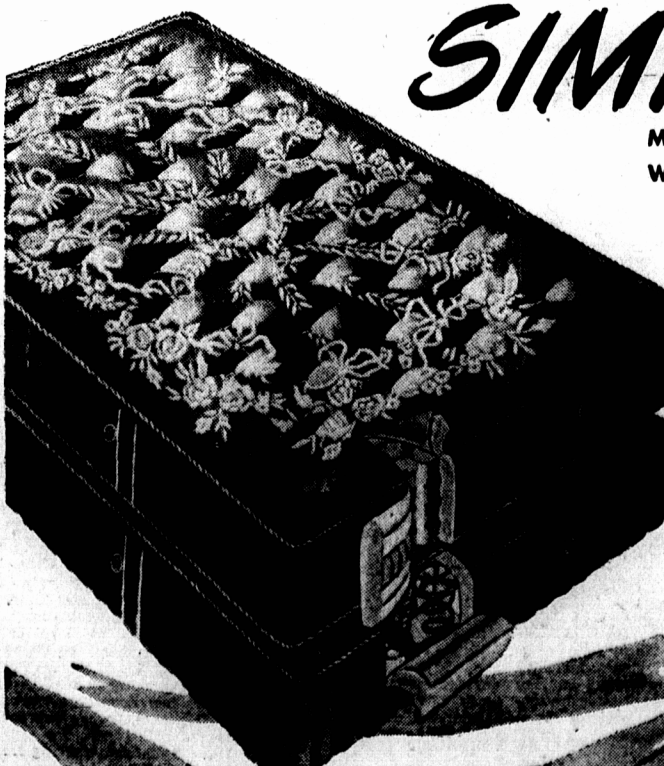
