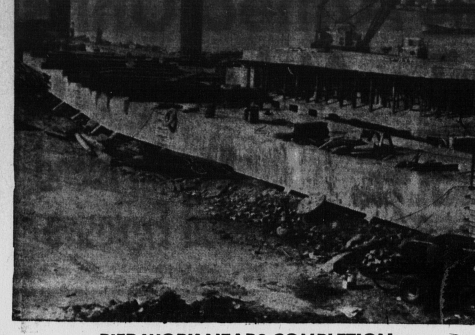


2 The Guardian, Charlottetown, Tues., Aug. 18, 1964. CAR Pier Completion Seen By End Of Month

BORDEN — The new pier at Borden should be serviceable by the end of the month according to Wilfred Clausen of Whitman, Benn and Associates, the consulting engineers on the job. The only work remaining is the placing of the fender system on the short arm of the pier and the completion of the lift bridge, a ramp used to load the cars on and off the ferries. The work on the pier was originally slated to be finished by June 8, but constant problems arose, including unavailable materials and the weather. The general contractors for the job, McNamara Construction, have had to have two extensions on their contract because of this. Despite this extra time needed the pier is expected to be completed by the end of the month, says Mr. Clausen. The complete order of rubber springs, vital parts used in the fender system, has arrived from Great Britain. Earlier the fact that these were not in was holding up the job. Since their arrival the fender system has been completed on the long arm of the pier, leaving only the short arm to do.
