CURIOS FACTS RECORDED.

The Currier line of steamers gives employment to 10,000 men. Lord Beaconsfield, who died with having received \$60,000 for "Emjyndon"—the largest sum ever paid for a novel in this country. There are 80,000 more widows than widowers in England. In France for every hundred widowers there are one hundred and ninety-four widows. If there were but one potato in the world, a careful cultivator might produce 10,000,000,000,000 in ten years, and that would supply the world with food once more.

There being many wicked tongues at work in a certain German town, a society has been formed for the suppression of scandal. Scandalous utterances will be taken up and fought out, the cost being defrayed by the society. A needle passes through eighty operations before it is perfectly made. The world's blind are computed to number about one million—about one sightless person to every 1,400 inhabitants.

It is computed on excellent authority that 400,000 larks are sold for the gourmand's table every year at Leadenhall Market alone. There were 159 railway servants killed in the United Kingdom last year while "standing on the line of duty" or crossing the metals in front of the trains. After a lapse of thirteen years the front of Buckingham Palace is to be painted. It will cost over \$100,000, and two tons of white lead will be used besides material to preserve the stone. With a population not much over half that of London, New York City contains 1,000,000 gallons of water, against 150,000,000 for London. Running 60 miles an hour a train of 250 tons, with the full braking weight of the train attached, and descending in the most favorable conditions, could be brought to a full stop in 900 feet; at 80 miles an hour in 1,500 feet; at 100 miles per hour in 2,250 feet; and at 90 miles per hour in 2,500 feet. A simple way to strengthen the voice is before going to bed bathe the chest and throat with cold water, and rub with a bath towel. To carry out this recipe regularly through cold weather will be an effort, but it certainly has its benefits. Many people add sea-salt to the water, and find it very invigorating.

TRUTH IS POWERFUL. The Revolution in Thought Which Huxley Lived to See Accomplished. In an article on Huxley the Evening Post eulogizes him for the service he has done to the world in the way of truth and honesty. Describing the incredible state of affairs when he stepped into the controversial arena, it says: "It is impossible for anyone not of middle age to go through the feeling toward scientific enquiry which prevailed when Huxley began his public career. It is enough to say that hardly anyone either in England or America dared to express freely the conclusions which he reached, after honest and conscientious study, concerning the age of the world or the origin of man's life. Not only the clergy, but the great mass of the laity, were suspicious of scientific men as a class, regarding them as prone to infidelity, and materialism, and in order to secure a favorable hearing it was necessary for the man of science to begin by announcing his conclusions as being the result of a quite in harmony with the truths of revealed religion. Agassiz was nearly canonized for declaring that men were descended from apes, and not the children of apes, and we could mention instances where professors only kept their chairs by following the example of Galileo."

When he died, it had ceased to be necessary for a man of science to apologize for his views or to show that they harmonized with current conceptions. Her Bentled Paw. In a large church in this city, which is always over-crowded with worshippers, there are some pious-minded men more frequently invite strangers out of their pews than in them. Last Sunday morning a large group of a civil service commissioner attended a church, and the usher seated her in a vacant pew, well toward the front. Just before the organist played the opening hymn the stranger, in a moment of nervousness, pulled out a handkerchief and a jingling of jet beads in the aisle, and a lady appeared beside the pew. She glanced at the occupant and smiled still in England or America, jingled herself out again. In another moment the usher appeared, politely asked the lady to allow him to show her to another pew, and gave her one opposite. Then the silk and jetted lady returned and devoutly took her seat—Washington Post.

Flowers for Invalids. In sending flowers to an invalid, it is much wiser to send them in dainty little bouquets, or a perfect single flower, than in long and narrow bouquets of sweet peas or violets to-morrow, than to send a large quantity of flowers in a formal bouquet that will last long and perhaps be banished from the sick-room altogether by the physician. A growing plant in blossom will give pleasure for a longer time than cut flowers. Both plants and flowers should be removed from the sick-room at night. In sending fruit to the sick, lay a few leaves of the plant or tree in a tiny basket or over the top, or tie a bunch of them to the handle of the basket. A basket of flowers that have grown under a large tree and give her order for a basket of fruit. In serving fruit to the sick, see that it is cold. Small fruits should be served on ice, and have a little chopped ice sprinkled over them, whether for the sick or well. A most delicious fruit course at dinner, to be served as a salad, or in the place of Roman punch, is of red and white currants, with powdered sugar, and little sugar and sherry. Red raspberries with ice are improved by adding to them a little lemon juice.—New York Evening Post.
