

City Tops Gota Mayor Is Elated

Informed of the City of Charlotte's going over the top in the current United Fund Appeal, Mayor A. William Gaudin, who is a host for a meeting of the Canadian Association of Mayors and Municipalities, has set the following message:

"I would like to express my heartfelt congratulations to the citizens of Charlotte on the news of the city exceeding its United Fund quota of \$118,667. It is our first year since the 'To Own Simons, Charlotte' campaign chairman, and his staff, who have done a special 'thank you' for a job well done.

"The province has still some distance to go in this first province-wide campaign, but, as with all past challenges, Prince Edward Island will succeed.

"Charlotte can once again be proud of its achievements, and our citizens, I am sure, will turn to help our neighbors in achieving their goals in this one-of-a-kind drive."

"All last returns had been turned in, and the campaign chairman, Brig. W. W. Reid, announced that Charlotte was the first island community to reach and exceed its objective.

"The chairman reported that city residents had contributed \$118,179.67 and that this amount should continue to climb, as there are still a number of divisions who have not yet completed canvassing their list of prospective donors.

Y's Men's Clubs To Sponsor Ballet Company Here Thus.

The sparkling and vital dance, the Les Grands Ballets Canadiens is currently on a 14-day tour of the East Coast and will be performing in Charlotte, N.C., Nov. 8.

Les Grands Ballets Canadiens had its beginnings in 1952 in the ballet school of its current artistic director, Christian Bouchard. Since that time it has grown in fame until it is now recognized as one of the leading North American ballet companies. The company receives direct support from the Canada Council for the promotion of the arts. This is the major factor which has enabled it to perform in such cities as Charlotte.

One of its performances in Charlotte will be on the CBC television both in full length and shorter features.

Among the ballets to be presented during its current tour are excerpts from the classics such as Swan Lake, The Sleeping Beauty, and The Pas de Deux (from Act 5 of Swan Lake). The Death of a Swan (La Mort du Cygne) which was immortalized by the famous ballerina Anna Pavlova.

The company will also dance Act Two of the ballet "The Emperor's New Clothes" and the "Fairy Tale" La Fille Mal Gardée.
