Souris One Of Busiest Towns In Maritimes At This Season

The town of Souris is one of the busiest spots in the Province these spring days. Two fish plants are giving employment to more than two hundred people, a number of whom are from Cape Breton and other parts of the Island; the Canadian Dock and Dredge Company is continuing its wharf construction and dredging project; the Henry J. Phillips and Sons Company are repairing the breakwater, and all told the town is alive and bustling. Eastern Packers with a combined staff of one hundred and thirty-seven have one group of workers engaged at their lobster cannery at the east end of Souris, and another labor force at the company's filleting and fish-meal plant, located on the waterfront. Four draggers are landing fish for the company, the Marjorie Mary Belle, Souris No. 2, Murray Harbour No. 1, and the Paula Marie.

The draggers remain at sea from five to seven days and are averaging about 40,000 pounds of fish per ton of net. They are returning to port a few days ago with a 65,000 pound cargo. Haddock predominates in the mixed catches which the ships are landing, with flounders second in quantity and cod third. Very few hake are being landed. Only about fifty per cent of the people employed by Eastern Packers are residents of Souris. Others come from such places as St. Charles, St. Peter's, Morrell, Oyster Bed Bridge and Cape Breton. The twelve men from the other Maritime Island are skilled filleters, and they are the backbone of the assembly-line system which has been organized to fillet and package the thousands of pounds of haddock, flounders and cod landed daily.

The Canadian Dock and Dredge Company has a large collection of floating equipment on the job at the railroad wharf. Scows, dredger, lighters, and a towboat, as well as smaller utility power boats, contribute to the general bustle on the waterfront. The company does not expect to complete its contract this year. The project includes wharf extension and the enlargement of the potato warehouse. The work being carried out by H. J. Phillips and Sons on the breakwater will employ about twenty-five men when it gets well under way.

3-Act Comedy Is Repeated

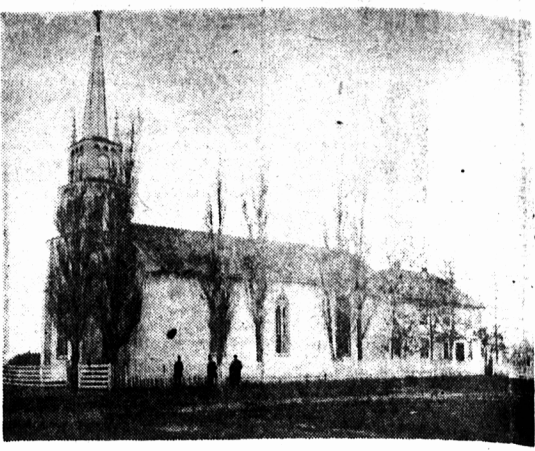
A repeat performance of "A Ready Made Family", a comedy in three acts, was presented to a capacity house at the A.D. MacKenzie Hall, Montague, last night.

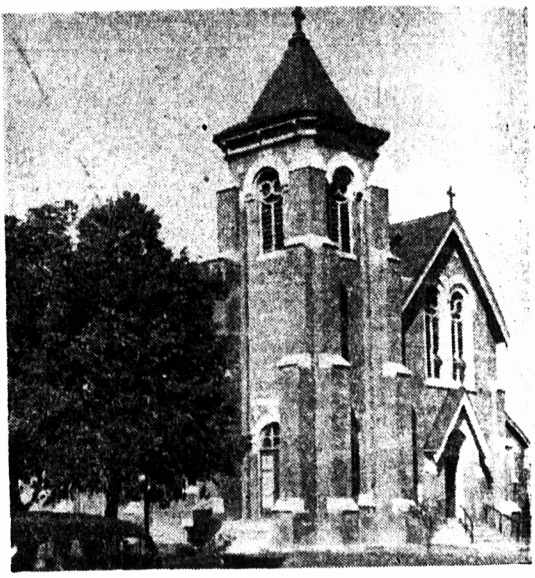

Historic Mission Of St. James At Geo'town



Old St. James Church, Georgetown; built in 1837, enlarged in 1844.

In the history of the French occupation of St. John's Island, mention is frequently made of Trois Rivières, or Three Rivers, a settlement on the southern and western shores of the harbour which is formed by the confluence of the Montague, the Brudenell and the Cardigan Rivers. Upon a point of land which divides the Montague from the Brudenell stood the residence of the Sieur de Roma, who was the representative of the governor of Port-Jacques in those parts, a sort of Intendant, also President of a large fishing company which existed there. He appears to have been a man of energy, anxious to further the development of the country over which he had, in a measure, jurisdiction. Especially did he wish to foster agriculture among the Acadian people, and to encourage them, he himself had a model farm, not very far from his residence. He is said also to have had a glass factory near to this farm.
