### THOUGHTS FOR OUR TIME

As the last month of 1955 rolls in hundreds of advertisers are making us more and more conscious of the approach of one of the biggest dates on the calendar. For, just before we tear off the last sheet, and put up our brand-new 1956 calendar, we will celebrate again the glorious Christmas season. In order to help us to appreciate the meaning of the great event which our Feast commemorates, which has been the wise traditional practice, through the Christian centuries, to prepare for the Feast with a holy season, lasting about a month, called Advent. The purpose of Advent is to prepare us to recognize the importance of the coming of Our Lord into the world. (The name "Advent" is the Latin word for "coming"). To achieve this end, we are encouraged to consider the state of mankind in the ages before the time of Christ. Man had fallen far, since the brief period of blessedness in which God had created his first parents. Far from being sole master of his environment, man was often hardly more than the pawn of world forces. His environment no longer yielded itself to his rule, but remained now rigid and rebellious. Man had to fight with all his might to maintain what control he had over the earth. Much of his life was a struggle for bare survival.

Even when he began to redevelop a civilization, his progress was slow and painful.  
**FAR FROM GOAL**  
 In our own day, we recognize that some success has crowned his tireless efforts, though, for instance, man is a long way from having conquered the diseases which threaten his life. Man is indeed far from the immortality which was to have been his lot. But man has come to know the rebellious far worse than those of his fellow material beings. There is a struggle which, now in the atomic age, has become more obviously desperate. As we see man's control over nature, becoming greater, we may well wonder, will the survivors of Hiroshima, if man would not be better off without this newly acquired achievement. Man's control over nature will only do him harm if he is not able to control himself! And man has consistently shown himself unable to quell the constant rebellion within him of greed and lusts, and weakness and laziness, against his better judgments. Here, indeed, is a paradox. Man.
