East Berlin's Workers Continue Loafers' Strike

BERLIN (AP) — East Berlin's sullen workers continued their loafers' strike Thursday and West Berlin mayor Ernst Reuter declared the grass-roots rebellion eventually would liberate all East Germany from the Reds.

The sit-down and slow-down tactics by thousands of workers has forced the Russians to lift their armed barricades along the city's East-West border and Western newspaper men got their first peek into the Eastern sector since Russian tanks broke the June 17 revolt.

At the Stalin alley housing project, where the uprising started, as many workers were loafing as were hammering and plastering. "They're still on a slow down," said a youth.

Reports filtering out of major East Berlin factories said thousands were dragging lazily, making only a pretence of work. They had gone on their sit-down with the lifting of travel restrictions across the sector borders as their secondary demand.

Their primary demand was the release of the thousands of their comrades arrested in the June uprising. Apparently they were not satisfied that the east German government was telling the truth when it declared last night that the "great majority" already had been freed.

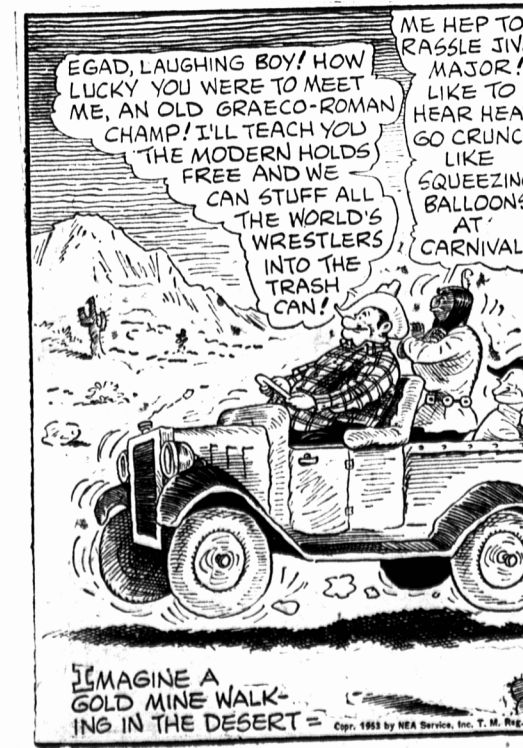

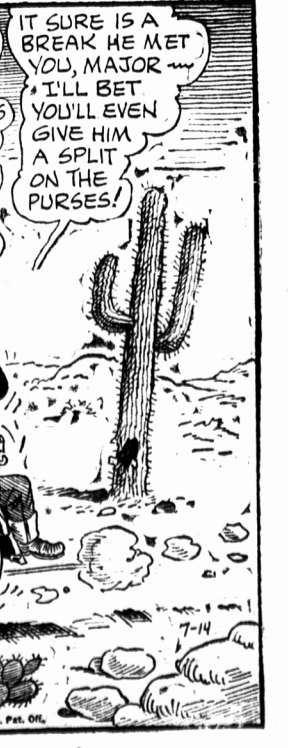

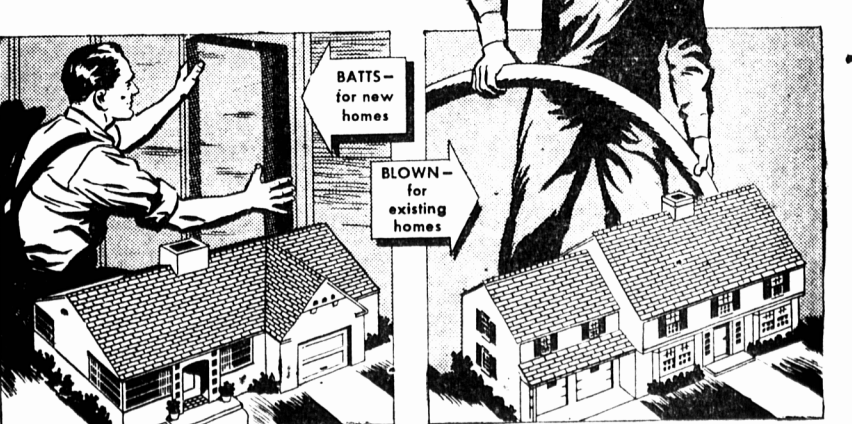
