

STUDY BREAK APPROVED FOR APRIL

Last year a petition was sent around campus by a concerned biology student asking for names of students who would like a study break between classes and exams.

The petition was presented to then Student Union President Rob Kelley around list Christmas and was taken to Senate in the early months

of 1987. The matter was turned over to the CCCC Committee (Curriculum, Course Change, and Calendar Committee).

The committee discussed the proposal though it was too late for anything to be done for 1987 April exams.

When Steve Wynne took the office of SU president this year, he contacted UPEI President Eliot concerning the proposal. Eliot informed him that the request was in the process

of discussion among members of the CCCC committee. During the last Senate meeting on Oct. 16, the proposal was put to a vote and it was unanimously decided that there be a two day study break before commencement of Exams.

Therefore, April exams will begin Wednesday, April 13 giving students a 4-day break (Sat., Sun., Mon., Tues.) to prepare for finals.

SIDE EFFECTS

Theatre Bandwagon is producing "Side Effects", a play about women and pharmaceuticals, which will tour to several Island communities in late October and early November.

The script was originally developed through workshops in Ottawa in 1985 by the Great Canadian Theatre Company and Women's Health Interaction. The characters portrayed in "Side Effects" are based on women, both in Canada and Bangladesh, who have lived through the experiences dramatised in the play.

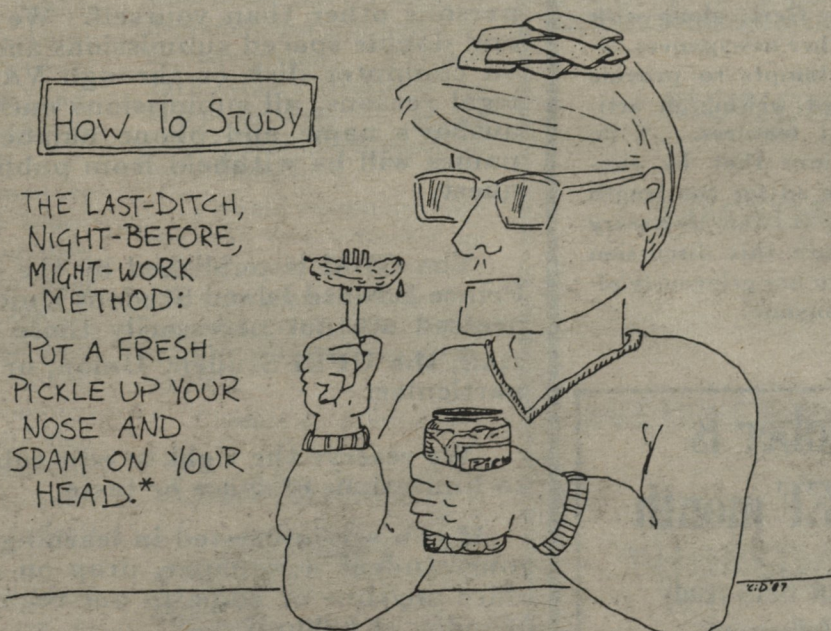

and 7. All showtimes are 8pm and the price of admission is \$3. Mann House, a recovery home for chemically dependent women is sponsoring this production, financially assisted by the secretary of State.

This tour will help promote Mann House and its programs.

"Side Effects", as well as being an educational tool, is an entertainment with elements of drama, comedy and music.
