

BIGGEST SUMMIT CONFERENCE

IAO Council Gives Its Okay For Dec. Meeting

PARIS (AP) — The North Atlantic Treaty Organization's permanent council Wednesday gave final approval for the free world's biggest summit conference.

President Eisenhower, Prime Minister Diefenbaker and the chiefs of government of the 12 other members of the NATO assembly to tighten the alliance and give it more atomic and scientific muscle.

The NATO assembly confirmed plans initiated at the Eisenhower-Macmillan talks in Washington last week.

Eisenhower told his press conference in Washington Wednesday he plans to attend, and that he hopes the talks will awaken interest in common problems of the free world.

The NATO council said the purpose of the unprecedented meeting is to strengthen NATO and assist army to give collaboration of the 15 nations the highest priority.

It is aimed at impressing the Russians with Western unity at a time when the earth satellite is advancing Russian scientific and national survival.

The West's leaders never have met in 12 years. This session, probably lasting three days starting Dec. 16, will enable them to discuss the possibility of national survival.

Eisenhower last visited Europe in 1955 to discuss the Geneva summit conference of Britain, France, the United States and Russia.

The conference is expected to take up these problems: 1. A massive appraisal of the atomic weapons stockpile.

2. Application of the latest techniques and supply of most modern material to NATO.

It was agreed at the last ATO council meeting in 1956 that the United States would supply missiles while keeping control of the atomic weapons. But the details are still under negotiation in Washington.

It is understood the chiefs will try to figure a faster way to put the agreement in effect.

A massive reappraisal of the alliance's military strategy in view of changing world conditions especially in spectacular missile developments. The supreme allied commander in Europe, Gen. Lauris Norstad, has compiled a working paper on this problem.

Under this heading will come an examination of plans by some countries, such as Britain, to cut armed manpower and reduce nuclear weapons.

4. Tightening political co-operation.

5. Strengthening cultural and economic ties including a program of aid to such members as Greece.
