## Special Cooking Tricks Suit Today's Chickens

"THE USUAL ways to cook broiler-fryers in this country are to bake, broil or fry them, 'en-casé' or 'en-croûte'," quipped the Chef. "All of these methods are as good today as they have been for generations. But we both agree that they must be adjusted to meet the seasoning needs of today's chickens."

**MARINATED CHICKEN BAKE**  
2 (2 1/2 lb.) broilers, quartered  
1-3 c. corn oil  
The Marinade  
1-3 c. fresh lemon juice  
1 1/2 tsp. fine instant onion  
1-3 tsp. garlic powder  
3 tsp. crushed dried tarragon  
2 tsp. salt  
1/4 tsp. pepper

Line good - sized baking pan with double duty foil. It, arrange chicken quarters, skin-side down. Heat together all remaining ingredients. When boiling, pour over chicken. Cover with foil. Refrigerate at least 2 hrs., up to all day to develop full flavor. To cook, drain off excess marinade from the chicken; reserve for basting and seasoning other foods. Spoon 1 tsp. marinade over chicken. Cover with foil. Bake 30 min. in mod. oven, 300 deg. F. Uncover and turn chicken. Bake uncovered at 350 deg. 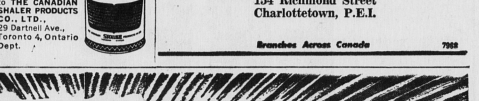
