DELAY BUILDING WARSHIPS

Sixty Five Thousand Men Out on Strike.

Thirty-Eight Thousand Pounds Disbursed as Strike Pay.

LONDON, Oct 11.—The executive committee of the Society of Amalgamated Engineers announces that 65,000 men are now either on strike or locked out. The sum of 3800 pounds was disbursed as strike pay on Saturday. The strike is causing great delay in the construction of warships. No new ships can be laid down in the admiralty dockyards and material is wanted for the completion of a number of vessels. Mr. Seimans, of Seimans Bros. & Co., speaking in behalf of the employers federation says that it is desired to get rid of trade unionism altogether. If this is not done the engineering trade of the country will go to the wall.

Another International Exhibition.

LONDON, Oct. 11.—Glasgow having decided to hold an international exhibition in 1901, the citizens have already started preliminary operations and avow their intention of beating the Chicago record. The guaranteed fund, though still in its infancy, amounts to \$700,000. It is expected that a total of 5,000,000 will be raised within six months.

Several Governors Resign.

HAVANA, Oct. 11.—Following the appointment of Marshal Blanco to succeed Captain General Weyler, Marquis Palmeral, civil governor of Havana, and other provincial governors have tendered their resignations.

Moody in Montreal.

MONTREAL, Oct. 11.—Dwight L. Moody opened a series of Evangelistic meetings at St. James Methodist Church on Saturday. The services on Saturday and Sunday were very largely attended. Moody suggested a collection for the sufferers by the forest fires along the Ottawa and \$175 was realized.

Hon. Mr. Fielding's Loan.

OTTAWA, Oct 11.—After considerable cabling between London and Ottawa Hon Mr. Fielding has made the proposed loan. The rate of interest as anticipated will be 2 1/2 percent; the minimum offer which will be considered 1 1/2 pounds for each 100 pounds. The duration of the loan will be 50 years. The last loan of Hon. Mr. Foster was 2 1/2 million pounds at three per cent. at a minimum of 95. The average price realized was 97 1/2.

HALIFAX, Oct. 11.—The football season opened on Saturday with a decided defeat of the United Service by the Wanderers.

LATEST NEWS BY WIRE AND MAIL.

ST. PETERSBURG, October 8.—Malaria, which has been prevalent at Taskend, Asiatic Russia, for four years, has not become virulent, and the deaths from that cause are estimated to number several thousand. Sanitary measures are useless. The Russian garrison at Mary has been transferred to Kransovodsk, on the Campaign Sea, to prevent its being envenomed by disease.

LONDON, Oct. 8.—Prof. Francis William Newman, the author and philosopher, is dead. Francis William Newman was a younger brother of the late J. Newman. He published numerous works on a variety of kindred subjects which may be generally classed as religious, philological, political and social.

SIMLA, October, 8.—The total casualties to British arms during the frontier troubles up to date have been 190 killed including fourteen British officers, and 550 wounded, including 34 officers.

HALIFAX, Oct. 8.—Elizabeth Noel, 19 years, arrived from St. John's Nfld., on the steamer Portia yesterday to go to Acadia Village School, Hortonville, N. S. The girl was spirited away on her arrival here and the chief of police is endeavoring to locate her.

VICTORIA, B. C., Oct. 8.—Five more of Victoria sealing fleet arrived today from Behring Sea, Ocean Belle, with 792 skins which, with 167 taken on the coast, makes a total catch of 959 skins for the season; Umbria, 1,03 skins, all save 197 taken in the Behring Sea, taken on Japan coast; Anne E. Paint, Capt. Bissett, brought 1,293 skins, 367 of which were taken in Behring Sea, and 15 at Cooper Island; City of San Diego, which arrived in command of Capt. McGraw, Captain Dr Martin having left her to join in the rush to Klondyke, had 450 skins to show for her Behring Sea catch; and Borealis, the last arrival, had 659 for the season, 312 of which were taken in Behring Sea.

LAGOS, West Coast of Africa, Oct. 8.—A French expedition, consisting of 200 soldiers and 2,000 carriers, has started from Porto Novo, coast of Dahomey, for Mikki whence it proceeds to the Hinterland of Lagos. The colonial government is taking active steps to prevent this force from encroaching upon British territory. The French officials, it is stated, have pressed natives of Lagos and their canoes into the service of the expedition.

ESTES PARK, Col., Oct. 8.—Forest fires are raging in the timber southwest of this place. Immense volumes of smoke are darkening the sky. Unless there is a rain storm the destruction will be enormous.

SIMLA, Oct. 8.—Gen. Sir William Lockhart, in command of the punitive expedition against the rebellious border tribes, has issued a proclamation to the Tirah Afridis and Orakzais, saying that in consequence of their breaking the treaty of 1881, the government is sending a force to march through their country. The final peace terms of the government will be announced to the tribes on the arrival of this force at their capital. Immediate submission to the British authorities is advised, in order to avoid unnecessary damage, otherwise punishment will follow any opposition to the British advance.

MONTREY, Mexico, Oct. 8.—A lince received of a bad accident 25 miles south of here. A tunnel is being constructed by the Mexican National Railroad, and a premature explosion of a blast occurred, killing four men outright and wounding ten others seriously. The accident is being investigated by the authorities.

HAMILTON, Ala., Oct. 8.—While returning from a party here late last night six persons in a boat were thrown into the Battalochie river and four of the occupants were drowned. Those drowned were Misses Lizzie Smith, Belle Key, Mary Swearingen and Ella Philips. Their escorts, Robert and John W. White, brothers, who caused the boat to capsize by rocking it, saved their own lives. Feeling is so intense against the two men that they have left town.

NEW YORK, October 8.—The London correspondent of the World learns that the Canadian Government in opposing the enlargement of the conference, was vigorously supported by Colonial Secretary Chamberlain, in letters, in which he transmitted to Lord Salisbury Canada's reply. His policy is that Colonial sentiment should be paramount in all matters when it does not clash with Imperial interests.
