KINGSTON, July 28.—Capt. Gaskin states that the assertion made by Benj. Folger that the American channel is the only one available for towing on the St. Lawrence is not true. Until some few years ago the Canadian Channel was almost entirely used and can be used the same again. There are at least three distinct channels for boats, viz., the Gananoque, Jackman, the Middle Channel or Fiddler's Elbow, and the American Channel, down past Clayton, which Folger speaks about. Capt. Gaskin also speaks about St. Clair Fiats Channel, which is in Canadian territory. It was started and built by the Canadian Government and has always been claimed as Canadian property. If we related there we could close off all the trade on the Detroit River. Then there is Lime Kiln crossing, between Bois Blanc Island and Amherstburg. It is almost all together in Canadian territory. If we stop traffic there, no American vessel can go down to Cleveland, Buffalo, or any lower lake ports.

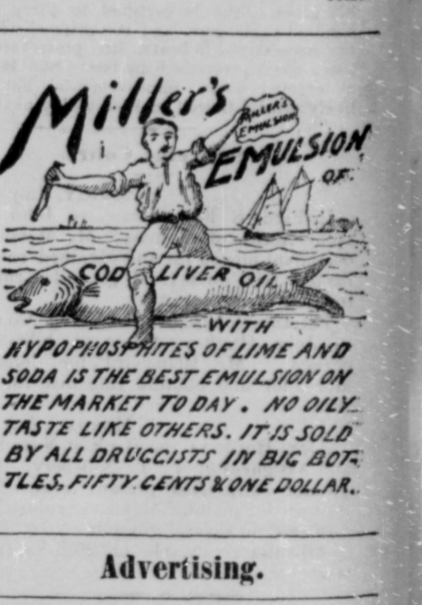
