LIBERAL POLICIES DESCRIBED AS THREAT TO NATIONAL UNITY

MONCTON (CP)—Opposition Leader Diefenbaker said Thursday night the Liberal government is dedicated to principles that can wreck the nation.

The Progressive Conservative leader told 1,200 persons at a party rally the flag issue is just part of the picture. He spoke in support of the Conservative candidate in Monday's Western bid by-election.

"We had a formula for amending the constitution in 1961-62, nobody was talking about dividing Canada, states with a date and associate states. You can't build a Canada like that," Mr. Diefenbaker said.

The Conservative government had dreamed of "omnibus" bills would have resulted in the situation Canada finds itself in today. "We would have abandoned that," he said.

The people of Quebec were "misled by false prophets" during the last federal election campaign, Mr. Diefenbaker charged. Promises made by the Liberals in 1962 had brought about a situation "dangerous to our country."

"I am afraid for Confederation. No one can be other than seriously concerned about what is happening."

Mr. Diefenbaker said the government had adopted the kind of attitude "that makes a mockery of citizenship." He said the
