Escapee Caught, Had Gone Fishing

A resident of Tignish, Gratton McCue, who broke out of the Alberton town jail Wednesday afternoon at North Cape and lodged in the Prince County Jail in Summerside.
The escape was made through a narrow opening in the steel door of the cell during a brief absence of the jailor.
A piece of "two by four" from the bunk was torn loose and used to loosen one of the inch and a half by half-inch thick welded steel bars in the door. The escapee is scheduled to appear in court in Summerside this morning on charges of being intoxicated in a public place and escaping lawful custody.
McCue is said to have distracted the jailor by asking him to make a phone call for him in order to get bail. The escapee is said to have spent most of the day fishing before being picked up by RCMP.
