Mystery Of Aviation Disaster Still Unsolved

VANCOUVER (CP)—The mystery of Canada's worst aviation disaster which claimed 62 lives last December, remains locked in the mighty snows of the Cascades. The latest attempt to uncover any trace of the TCA airliner which disappeared over the mountains 100 miles east of here with 59 passengers and three crew members, has fizzled.

An "inch-by-inch" aero photography survey of a 500-square-mile area where the plane is believed to have crashed, has been completed.

"They didn't find a single clue, not a trace," a TCA spokesman said Tuesday. "It seems pretty hopeless now until after the snow thaws."

DON'T PLAN SEARCH

Unless any new clues are en-

countered, a concentrated renewed search is not planned until the spring, said the official. Official weather reports indicate as much as 20 feet of snow may have fallen in the upper levels of the Cascade range since the night when the Calgary-bound North Star was lost.

Weeks of searching by air and from the ground failed to disclose a clue to the disappearance. Low clouds, snow and extreme air turbulence hampered the search for the first nine days. On the 10th day, more than 50 planes criss-crossed a 1,200-square-mile section of terrain.

Ground parties covered more than 200 miles of rugged trails and a special alpine group scaled seven peaks towering to 8,000 feet. All search efforts were in vain.

An account of what preceded the tragedy the night of Dec. 9 is taken from log books of TCA operations and a secret RCAF radar station.

ENGINE ON FIRE

The aircraft—flight 810 east-bound—took off from Vancouver airport at 6 p.m., two hours late. Fifty-seven minutes later, Capt. Allan Clarke radioed that a warning device on the instrument panel signalled No. 2 engine was on fire. The pilot shut off the engine, feathered the propeller and reported he was returning to Van-
