Hellyer Faces Tough Job In Move To Unity Services

By DAVE McINTOSH OTTAWA (CP)—Will Defence Minister Paul Hellyer be able to unify the armed forces? Two former defence ministers—the late Brooke Claxton, Liberal, and George Parkes, Conservative—tried and failed. Gen. Charles Foulkes, former chairman of the chiefs of staff committee, and Lt.-Gen. Guy Simonds, former chief of the general staff, have told the Commons defence committee that the only way integration can be carried out is by a complete decision from the top. They said gradual integration—one of the services at a time—wouldn't work. Examples abound in duplication and triplication caused by rivalry among the services. After the Second World War, each service insisted on buying

defence headquarters.

The committee system has reached the point, for example, where the joint telecommunications committee has nine sub-committees, one of them which has the title "joint telecommunications co-ordinating sub-committee of the joint telecommunications committee." There have been some successful moves toward integration, however. The army dental corps was placed on a tri-service basis in 1959. The service colleges were put on a tri-service basis after the war. In 1952 the army postal corps took over operation of all postal services in the armed forces. In 1959 the medical services were combined and a little later the chaplains were unified.
