

# Wilson Says Britain Deceived By Prime Minister On Economy

LONDON (CP) — Labor Leader Harold Wilson says Prime Minister Sir Alec Douglas-Home has deceived Britain on the state of its economy and maintains the election-time boom has been financed by overseas borrowing of about £1,000,000 a day.

Aiming his main thrust on reports of a widening import-export trade gap, Wilson told a rally Wednesday night the gap has been bridged only "by borrowing over the past 18 months £230,000,000 from the Commonwealth — the Commonwealth that they (the Conservatives) were prepared to sell down the river in the (European) Common Market negotiations."

NOT A SURPRISE  
Earlier Wednesday, Treasury Chief Reginald Maudling conceded that the figures — the worst since 1953 — are a disappointment although not a great surprise. He insisted the economy is not becoming "overheated" and that there is no financial crisis in the office as labor predicts.

Various exceptional factors — all payments to Kuwait, settlement of a Korean war debt with the United States and one deal that took £50,000,000 out of the country — made the figures for the last quarter seem worse than they actually are, Maudling declared.

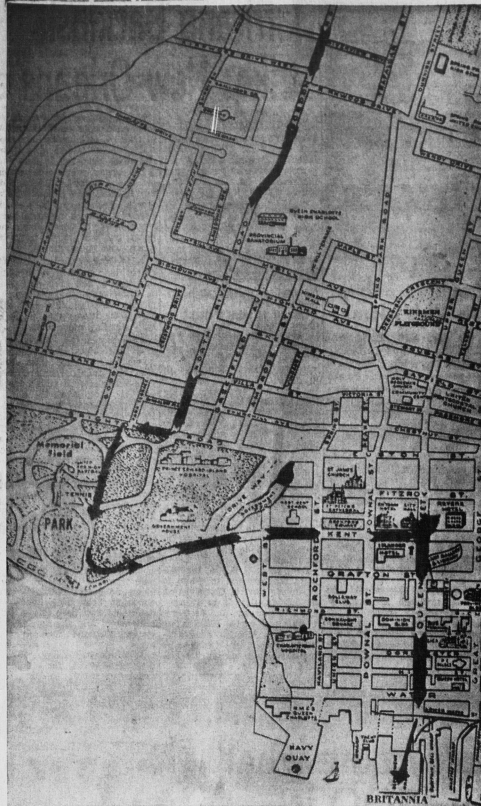
