WIMBLEDON, England (Reuters) — Rod Laver overwhelmed fellow Australian Marty Mulligan 6-2, 6-1 Friday to win the men's singles title at the all England lawn tennis tournament for the second straight year. Victory for the 25-year-old, red-haired southpaw meant he had matched the third of four titles needed for tennis "grand slam". He has the Australian, French and Wimbledon championships and needs only the American title to do it. Laver was an excited Laver told reporters afterward. "I guess Marty was a little nervous at the start. He is a determined player with a solid game. Having played in a final, it should give him a lot of confidence." Meanwhile, Neale Fraser and fellow Australian Roy Emerson were upset in a semi-final match by the American Billie Jean Moffitt in a women's double semi-final to defeat Justina Brink of the U.S. and Margaret Smith of Australia 6-3, 6-4. Mrs. Susan meets Mrs. Vera Solova of Czechoslovakia today in the women's singles final. This year's showing by eastern Europeans in Wimbledon is unparalleled in 87 years of play. No player from a Communist country has ever before reached a final match at Wimbledon. This year two Yugoslavs and a Czech are in finals.

AS SCULLER DISQUALIFIED Dispute Rocks Regatta; Poles Quit in Protest

HENLEY, England (CP) — A mighty dispute rocked the Henley Regatta Friday, resulting in the withdrawal of the Polish team. The Poles quit in protest against the disqualification of Eugeniusz Kubiak, their dominant sculler, for going off course in his head-on semifinal race against Australia's Stuart MacKenzie, the defending champion. Kubiak flashed across the finish line a clear three lengths ahead of the 25-year-old MacKenzie. His disqualification for interference kept alive MacKenzie's hopes of winning an unprecedented sixth straight championship.
