President, Guardian Publishing Co., Ltd.; president, Imperial Biscuit Co., Ltd.; president, McLure & MacKinnon Silver Fox Farms Ltd.; president, Charlottetown Selling Agencies, Ltd.; born at North Rustico, P. E. I.; 1875; educated Prince of Wales College, Charlottetown; public school teacher, 1878-99; entered commercial life and salesman until 1910, when became interested in Fox Farming, making specialty of Silver Foxes; opened the American markets for the products of P. E. I. ranches; recognized most outstanding figure in Fur Farming in Canada. Member, Legislative Assembly, P. E. I. 1923-30; elected for Queens County to House of Commons 1930; member, Charlottetown Board of Trade Club, Caledonia; societies, A. F. & A. M.; I. O. O. F.; Conservative; religion, Presbyterian.



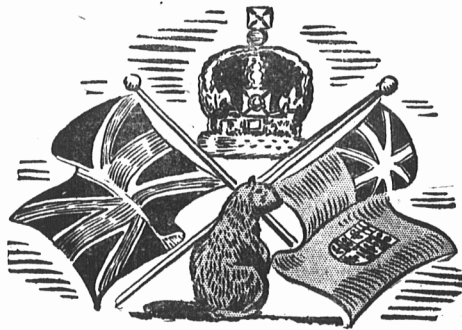
W. A. STEWART

Born at Charlottetown; Educated at Charlottetown Public Schools; Director, Moore & McLeod, Ltd.; Managing Director Estate D. Stewart; Alderman, Charlottetown, 1922-24; Director, Y. M. C. A., 1930-31; Treasurer, Y. M. C. A., 1922-31; Chairman, Protestant Orphanage Board; Mason and Oddfellow. Member, Caledonia Club, Sons of Scotland, Rotary; Charter Member Charlottetown Club. First elected to P. E. I. Legislature 1931. Politics, National Conservative. Elected to Legislature as Assemblyman in the 1939 Election. Religion, Presbyterian.



LT. COL. D. A. MacKINNON, D.S.O.

Silver Fox Farmer; Secretary-Treasurer, McLure & MacKinnon Silver Fox Farms, Limited (established 1927); Secretary-Treasurer, Imperial Biscuit Co., Ltd.; Secretary Guardian Publishing Co., Ltd.; Director, Provincial Exhibition Association. Born Highfield, P. E. I., November 12, 1876; Educated: Public Schools. Started as a breeder of Silver Foxes at the Vimy Ranch near Charlottetown, P. E. I., 1919; became world wide known through breeding World's Champions and numerous prize-winning Foxes. Prominent in Militia previous to Great War; twice on all-Canadian Artillery Teams, 1907 and 1911; qualified in four branches of Artillery, Signalling, Musketry and Machine Gun. Commanded 36th Battery, C. F. A., and 8th Brigade, C. F. A., in Great War. Mentioned in despatches; Decorated Distinguished Service Order and Croix de Guerre with Palm. Made Aide-de-Camp to Governor-General of Canada, 1922. Clubs: Charlottetown, Charlottetown Golf Societies; I. O. O. F.; C. F. A. & A. M. Recreations: Horse Racing; broke World's Trotting Record on Ice with "The Yank", January 14, 1923. Was prominent Maritime Athlete, 1897-99, holding Championship for Mile Run Conservative. United Church of Canada.

RUSSELL C. CLARK, M.L.A.

Born Mount Stewart, 1878, son of Solomon C. Clark and Hannah Newberry. Educated at Mt. Stewart High School, and Charlottetown Business College. Married Marion McKay. Has two sons, Stirling K. and Kerr W. Is founder and owner of Clark Bros., Mt. Stewart, Montague, and St. Peters. Lobster packer, exporter of farm produce, director Charlottetown Fur Sales, director Associated Shippers, and director Charlottetown Can Co. As Liberal candidate in Provincial politics he was defeated in 1922, elected in 1927, defeated in 1931, elected in 1936 and again in 1939. Religion, United Church. Residence, Mt. Stewart.
