NEW PROTEST TO JAPANESE AT TIENTSIN

Indignities To Britons At Concession Barriers Continue—Food Situation Worse.

TIENTSIN, June 23—(AP)—The British Consul-General sent a new protest to the Japanese today against the indignities and searching of British subjects at concession barriers, but a fresh incident of that kind was reported almost immediately thereafter.
Cecil Davis, an honorary agent for the New Zealand Government, declared he was slapped three times with his passport by a Japanese gendarme who, with three colleagues, forced him to stand naked in the examining room.
