

Maritime Press Association. Reports of Our Visitors.

The members of the Maritime Press Association are reporting very favorably concerning the Island Province recently visited by them.

"The man who visits Prince Edward Island expecting to see a land as level as a billiard table, and entirely free from stone, will be disappointed. He will see a charming picture of a cultivated and well-wooded province, with villages and fertile farms dotted along the coast, and by the sides of the bays and rivers.

There is an Indian tradition that when the great Manitou created the world he finished his work in the maritime provinces. The stones left in his apron after the rest of the globe had been covered he dumped where Nova Scotia now stands, while he shook out the dust that remained where Prince Edward Island to-day blossoms and thrives.

The island railway has for some years been sadly maligned by commercial travelers and others, who make it the subject of their feeble wit and delight to tell about its alleged curves, so sharp that the engine driver can shake hands with the brakeman on the rear car, and how, when a passenger misses the train at one station, he can walk across lots and catch it at the next stopping place.

Charlottetown is finely laid out, with wide streets running at right angles, and with some taste and comparatively small expense on the part of the city authorities in planting trees, etc., could be transformed into one of the most beautiful cities in the east.

spot, is the pride of Charlottetonians, and its lovely walks are crowded with citizens and visitors up to a late hour at night. Music is discoursed by the band two or three evenings a week, and thus the people have free open air promenade concerts.

The chief feature of the day in Charlottetown was the visit to the market. Market days are held twice a week—Tuesdays and Fridays. It appears that the people buy nearly all their supplies of meat, vegetables and dairy products on those two days.
