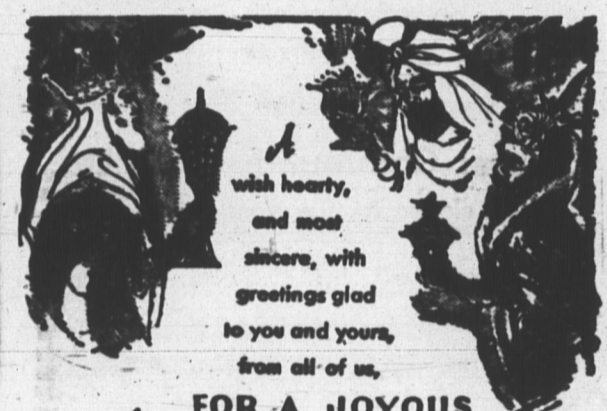

**Steelmakers Mark Record Year In U.S.**

CLEVELAND (AP) — United States steelmakers can celebrate their biggest production year in history this Christmas week. At the same time they are getting encouraging signs that lagging production is on the rebound.

This paradoxical situation is largely the result of strike hedging in 1965. Steel users built inventories in the spring because of the possibility of a steel industry strike. When no strike developed, consumers began trimming inventories. But the early surge in production helped the industry coast to an annual record, passing a record of 127,100,000 tons set last year, Steel Magazine reports.

The old record was equalled Saturday, Steel says, estimating that "the final count on Dec. 31 will be about 131,000,000 tons."

Production totals have been edging upward for the last three weeks. Output for the week ended Saturday was estimated at 2,210,000.

"The Christmas holidays will cut into production," Steel says, "but December output is expected to be around 9,000,000 tons. At this figure, December's performance would surpass that of November, when production was around 8,800,000 tons."

"As soon as the Christmas and New Year's holidays are past, production will rebound in response to a rising trend of new orders," the metal working weekly reports.

**North Sea Gas Find Substantial**

LONDON (Reuters) — Oil shares soared here this week within minutes of an official announcement that a British oil firm had found sufficient natural gas under the north sea to justify piping it 80 miles to shore.

The gas was found by British Petroleum, in which the British government has a 51-per-cent financial stake. It is the first productive gas deposit found after several months of sea searching by Canadian, British, American, Dutch and French companies which sank wells as much as 8,000 feet deep.

A spokesman for British Petroleum said the company's scientists are confident that the first well would sustain a flow of more than 10,000,000 cubic feet a day.

Power Minister Fred Lee said if all goes well a group of wells in the gas field could pump 50,000,000 cubic feet a day by 1967 or 1968, which would give as much energy as 500,000,000 tons of coal.

Additional wells will be sunk to see whether the supply will reach the economic level—enough to last 15 to 20 years.

**Estimate 60 Road Deaths On Holiday**

OTTAWA (CP)—Sixty persons will die in automobile accidents in Canada over the Christmas holiday weekend, the Canadian Highway Safety Council has predicted.

The prediction is for the period between 6 p.m. Friday and midnight Monday.

The council says in the last 10 years 500 people have died on Canada's highways during the Christmas weekend, an average of 50 a year. In 1964, the road death toll was 57 for Christmas.

The council's executive director, W. Arch Bryce, said in a statement, "the hard cold fact for Christmas this year is that 60 will die and 1,200 will be injured."

"What a way to celebrate Christmas. While the world basks in a glow of peace and goodwill hundreds of Canadian households will be shrouded in grief. If only goodwill could enter the hearts of the motorists and pedestrians, death and injury could disappear."

**DAMAGE CHURCH PROJECT**

OAKVILLE (CP) — Vandals caused more than \$650 damage to a \$212,000 United Church under construction here, police reported Wednesday. Fuel oil was sprayed on the roof and concrete siding of the downtown project. Damage to the church followed weekend vandalism at the E. J. Orr Public School here, causing nearly \$500 damage.

CUT BROADCASTS  
PARIS (Reuters) — All live programs on French state radio and television were cut Wednesday for the second consecutive day by a technicians' work stoppage. The strikers who are demanding better pay and conditions, are due to go back to work Thursday.

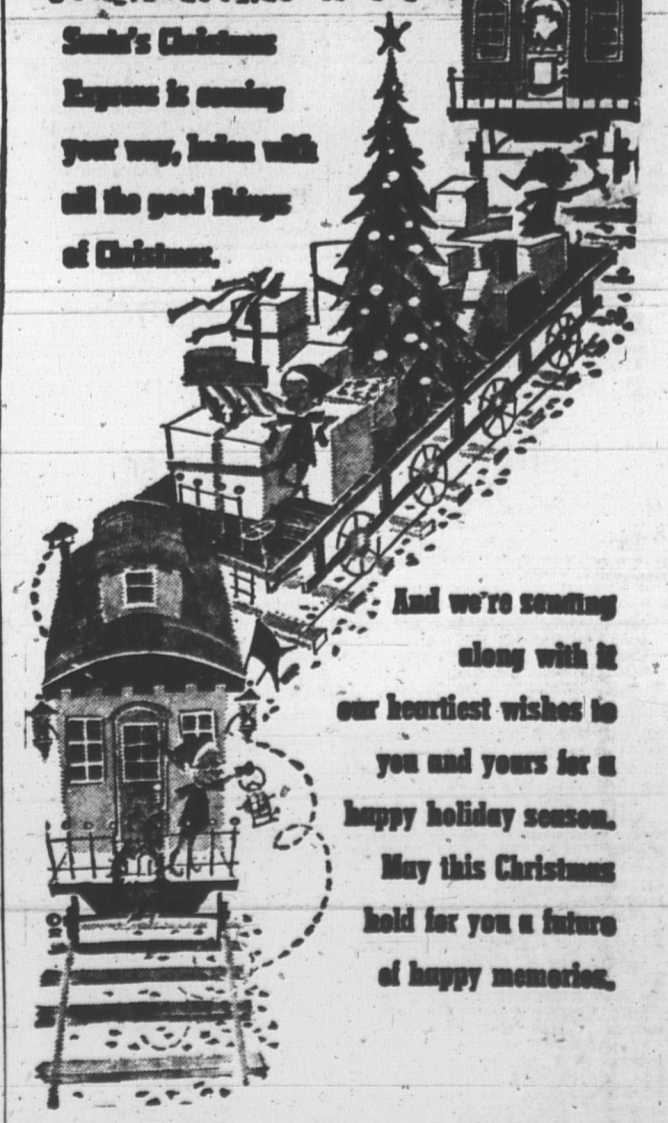
