## CURRENCIES

MONTREAL (CP) — The United States dollar in terms of Canadian funds was unchanged at \$1.07 17-32. Pound sterling was unchanged at \$3.01 7-16.

## NEW YORK

NEW YORK (AP) — The stock market continued to present a scrambled pattern Thursday as the over-all statistics worked mildly lower.

The Dow Jones industrial average lost 3.51 at 937.50. The Associated Press average of 60 stocks dipped 1.2 to 347.6 with industrials off 1.1, rails up 1.0 to record high for the year and industrials off .6.

Booming car sales and a dividend increase by Ford were sufficient cause for an advance of "big three" autos. Ford and Chrysler added only 1/4 each while General Motors suddenly jumped 1 3/4.

Among Canadians, McIntyre Porcupine advanced 1/2 and Canadian Marconi gained 1/4. Among losers, Aluminum Ltd. and Dome Mines each dropped 1/4, Hudson Bay Mining went down 1/4 and Granby Mining lost 1/4.

Prices were generally higher on the American Stock Exchange.

Among industrials, Brazilian Traction gained 1/4 while Canadian Marconi lost 1/4. Canadian Javelin gained 1/4. Preston moved up 5-16 and Molybdenum dropped 1-16. In oils, Jupiter Corp. advanced 1/4 and Scurry Rainbow dropped 1/4. What stocks did:

## TORONTO

TORONTO (CP) — Base metal stocks rocketed ahead on the Toronto Stock Exchange Thursday in moderate trading.

Pine Point led the rise with a gain of 6 1/2 to 83. The lead-zinc producer, which is controlled by Cominco, sold as low as 43 in June and has been rising steadily in the last month. Cominco, which had 78.2 per cent of Pine Point's outstanding common stock at last count, jumped 1/2 to 47 1/2 while CPR, which controls Cominco, was up 1/4 to 67 1/4.

Falconbridge climbed 1 to 105 1/4.

In the industrial list, Greater Winnipeg Gas, a distributor of natural gas in the Greater Winnipeg area, climbed 1/4 to 25 1/4 and sold as high as 26 1/4 at the opening.

Goodyear Tire advanced 10 to 205, Ford of Canada 1 1/4 to 144 1/4, Canadian Tire 1 1/4 to 55 1/4, Texaco 1 to 51 1/4, Imperial Oil 1 1/4 to 54 1/4 and General Motors 1 to 117.

On index, industrials were down .07 to 167.38. Golds were up .25 to 152.94, base metals 1.05 to 83.02, western oils .71 to 105.85 and the TSE index .06 to 157.40.

### Tryon Resident Ticket Holder In Sweepstake

A resident of Tryon, P.E.I., is the holder of a ticket on a horse which is scheduled to run in the Cambridgeshire at New Market, England, Saturday.

The horse, Asatia, with a corresponding ticket number CK 8656, was drawn by a person from Tryon under the name of plume of Lucky.

A total of 424 tickets held by Canadians were drawn Wednesday and Thursday based on this running of the Irish Sweepstakes but less than half have a chance at the big money prizes.

Tickets were drawn on all 85 horses eligible for the English race, but only 40 are expected to start.

Holders of tickets on the winning horse will collect \$150,000 in the three-yearly international lottery held in aid of hospitals in the Irish Republic, with prizes of \$60,000 and \$30,000 respectively going to holders of tickets on the second and third finishers.

All 424 Canadian whose tickets were drawn are assured of a prize based on the total of the pool, expected to be around \$1.100. These will go to holders of tickets on horses who fail to start or run out of the money.
