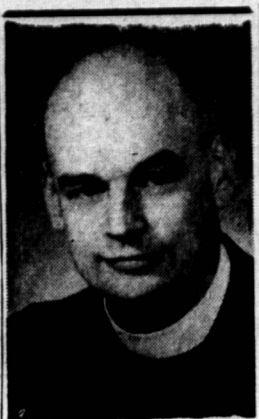

BIBLE SOCIETY

The Rev'd. K. G. McMillan, B.A., B.D., the new General Secretary of the British and Foreign Bible Society in Canada, will be on the Island from September 1st to 3rd. He is to preach at S. Andrew's Presbyterian Church, Montague, on Sunday Morning next, and to the combined congregations of Summerside that evening at a joint-service of worship in the Baptist Church. He will address the Annual Meeting of the Prince Edward Island Auxiliary of the Bible Society on Tuesday afternoon, September 3rd, at 2:30 o'clock in the Kirk Hall of S. James' Church, Charlottetown, and will speak on "Morning Devotions" over CFCY on September 3rd. The General Secretary has just returned from a visit to international headquarters in London, England, and to a meeting of the World Bible Societies in San Paul and Rio de Janeiro, stopping off at Bermuda, Jamaica, Trinidad and British Guiana en route.

P. E. I. Ayrshires Shine In R. O. P.

A Charlottetown Experimental Farm cow, Charlottetown Dimple Girl, topped the senior 3-year-old class in the 365-day division reported in the current issue of the Canadian Ayrshire Review. She produced 11,888 lbs of 4.5 milk for 507 lbs of butter fat. She is sired by the imported bull Burton Duellist.
Earle MacRae of Brookfield had three cows qualify among those listed in the Review. One them, Raeburn Trinket, won fame for topping both the 305-day and the 365 day brackets in R.O.P. Her 305-day performance accounted for 15,250 lbs of milk with an average test of 4.40 and 6.31 lbs fat. Her 365-day record was 16,638 lbs of milk and 694 lbs fat for an average test of 4.15 pc.
Raeburn Winnie produced 9,364 lbs of milk, 372 lbs fat for an average test of 3.97. She was a senior two-year old at the time and her test was for 305 days.
Heather's Millie, as a senior four-year old, produced 11,759 lbs

of milk, 514 lbs fat for an average test of 4.37 for owner Brenton Stead, Souris R.R. Millie was reserve senior and reserve grand champion at the Provincial Exhibition at Charlottetown this year.
