## Delinquent Taxpayers' List To Be Published

MONTAGUE — A list of delinquent taxpayers in the Town of Montague will be published Friday, July 13. It was decided at a regular meeting of the town council last night. Any unsettled accounts after this period will be handed to the town magistrate for further action. The date for this settlement was set for Sept. 1. Tenders for the surplus fire truck are to be called immediately. It was decided this truck which is suitable for fire fighting carries two chemical tanks, a 200 gallon water storage tank and 150 feet of 1 1/2 inch hose. It was the feeling of the council members it could be easily sold to some community for fire-fighting purposes. In the police report presented by the town policeman, Ed. Downie it was noted that \$205.50 was received in fines and that 21 cases were before the court. In the streets report by Councilor Reid it was noted that \$13,238.75 of paving had been completed during the month. It was also decided that the cross lines for pedestrians should be installed and that some parking areas would also be marked out. Four councillors, Cameron Reid, Charles J. Fraser, Frank Atwood, Jr., and Dr. A. E. Kings were present for the monthly meeting of Montague Town Council also present were Mayor B. H. Yeo who presided over the meeting and town clerk, G. Arnold Wrightman. Absent on business were Councilors Cyril Johnston and John Hughes.

## Remand Is Given On Break Charge

On a charge of break, entry and theft, Robert Bernard Fairweather, 3840 Lakeshore, Golden Grove Road, N.B., was remanded until July 13 for sentence, by Magistrate James B. Johnson, QC, in Queen's County magistrate's court yesterday. Fairweather is charged with breaking and entering the dwelling of Eric Stewart, Wood Islands West, to which he was remanded at an earlier hearing. Charged with possession of stolen goods, one pair of rubber boots, fishing lines and hooks, a fishing rod and a fishing reel, counsel, John J. Holmes for the defence and Alan K. Scates for the crown, was given Blaise Bernard Gallant, Stouffville, until July 23. By consent of counsel, Gerald R. Foster for the defence and Deputy Attorney-General J. Arthur McGuigan for the crown, Donald Joseph MacDonald, Charlottetown, charged with the possession of an offensive weapon, a .22 calibre rifle, dangerous to the public, was remanded until Aug. 9, at 7:30 p.m., with the hearing to take place in Georgetown. Charged with driving while intoxicated and giving a false name, was remanded until July 23, by consent of counsel, Lester P. O'Donnell and Mr. Scates, an adjournment until July 18 was given.

**CARDINAL DIES**  
VATICAN CITY (AP) — Giovanni Cardinal Fanfani, a member of the Vatican Council, died Saturday of a heart attack while visiting his southern Italian hometown, the Vatican announced. His death — the first since March 8, 1961, to a 60-year-old man, was each fined \$10 and costs or five days.
