Fined \$500 For Smuggled Cigarets

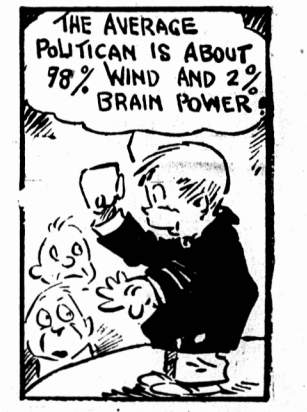
