A price for advance tickets

will be set, anyone can  
pick up these tickets. Remember  
advance tickets are cheaper and  
guarantee you to get into the event.

A student who gets to the door  
the night of an event and does not  
have an advance ticket, will pay  
\$1.00 more. Non-students will pay  
\$1.00 more at the door as well.

A non-student who buys an advance  
ticket for the cheaper price will be  
required to pay \$1.00 more at the  
door (as non-student prices are  
higher).

Student I.D. MUST, I repeat  
MUST be shown at the door.

Any student who forgets their  
Student I.D. will be charged the  
non-student price. So remember  
your I.D. is IMPORTANT. Non-  
students must also present I.D.  
to show they are of age. Please  
read this policy carefully, as it  
stands for all year.
