Students Fire Facsimile Of Vinland Map NEW HAVEN, Conn. (AP)—A group of Yale law school students set fire here to a facsimile of the Vinland map, which Yale scholars say is the first cartographic proof that Leif Ericson beat Christopher Columbus to the new world by 500 years. The students, members of the Society for the Promotion of Christopher Columbus, held placards saying: Vikings Go Home!, Yale Must Turn Over A New Leaf, Whoever Heard of the Knights of Ericson? and We're With You, Chris! The map-burning took place outside the Beinecke Library, where the original Vinland map is kept.

Probe Started Into Rumors From Orphanage EDMONTON (CP) — The Journal says provincial welfare authorities have launched an inquiry at the Alberta Protestant home for children in north-east Edmonton following rumors of a child beating and the alleged rape of a 14-year-old girl in the home Oct. 1. Police confirmed they are investigating. The Journal says parents of a 12-year-old girl who was withdrawn from the home claimed she was injured on the hands, back and abdomen. Mrs. Margaret Stuhl, a supervisor at the home for children from broken homes, is quoted as confirming that the girl was beaten and that the girl came to Mrs. Stuhl's room in the middle of the night for assistance because she was hemorrhaging. Mrs. Stuhl also told of the reported rape. Police said the 14-year-old girl reported she was attacked in bed in her third-storey room and that investigation continued. Twenty-two children are the home which is administered by a board chosen from 30 judges of the Loyal Orange Association and Ladies Orange Benevolent Association in Alberta. The children range from four to 17 years.
