TORONTO TORONTO (CP) - The stock market struggled against early downer and trading volume, pulling sharply ahead in the last hour of trading. The Toronto Stock Index gained almost three points in that hour. Base metals and western oils, however, remained on the downside all day. Trading volume was the lightest in a year. In the main, the price of provincial Pipe Line, Leam and Publishing and Distillers Segars all climbed at the end of the trading range. Dominion Foods and Steel rose 1/4, Walker-Gooderham 1/4, Canadian National 1/4 and Bell Telephone 1/4.

On the exchange, industrials edged up to 82 1/2 and gold 86 to 99.16. Base metals slipped 1/2 to 163.52 and western oils 1/2 to 98.62. The Toronto was 1,170 shares lighter since July 4, 1961 - compared with 1,500 shares heavier in 1960. In base metals, Falconbridge fell 1/4 and Noranda 1/4, while the main stock market advanced 1/4. Among speculative, Northgate fell 1/2 cents to 87 1/2. The Dow Jones Industrial 15 cents to \$410. Western oils saw Hudson's Bay drop 1/4, Home 1/4 and Defiance 1/4. Calgary and Edmonton gained 1/4 and Pacific Petroleum 1/4.
