## Permit For Apartment Meets With Protests

The issuance of a building permit for a new four-unit apartment, reportedly set for construction on Lansdowne Avenue, saw protest yesterday from property owners and tenants along the area enclosed by North River Road, McGill Avenue extension and Goodwill Avenue.

One of the strongest arguments against issuance of a permit is the knowledge, as announced in City Council recently, that the town planning committee is finally bringing in the proposed "master plan" for Charlottetown and its growth in the years to come.

They maintain there are large zoned areas for apartment house construction and object to the building of one in the neighborhood where the dominant feature is the single-family home and "property taxes are among the highest in the City of Charlottetown."

In fact, because the construction of apartment buildings would tend to downgrade property values, owners are already considering a request for a re-assessment of their properties in view of a building permit having been issued.

It was announced at the meeting that the president of the Canadian Bar Association, Hansen Hansard, QC, Montreal, and Mrs. Hansard will visit Prince Edward Island July 6.
