Dear students:

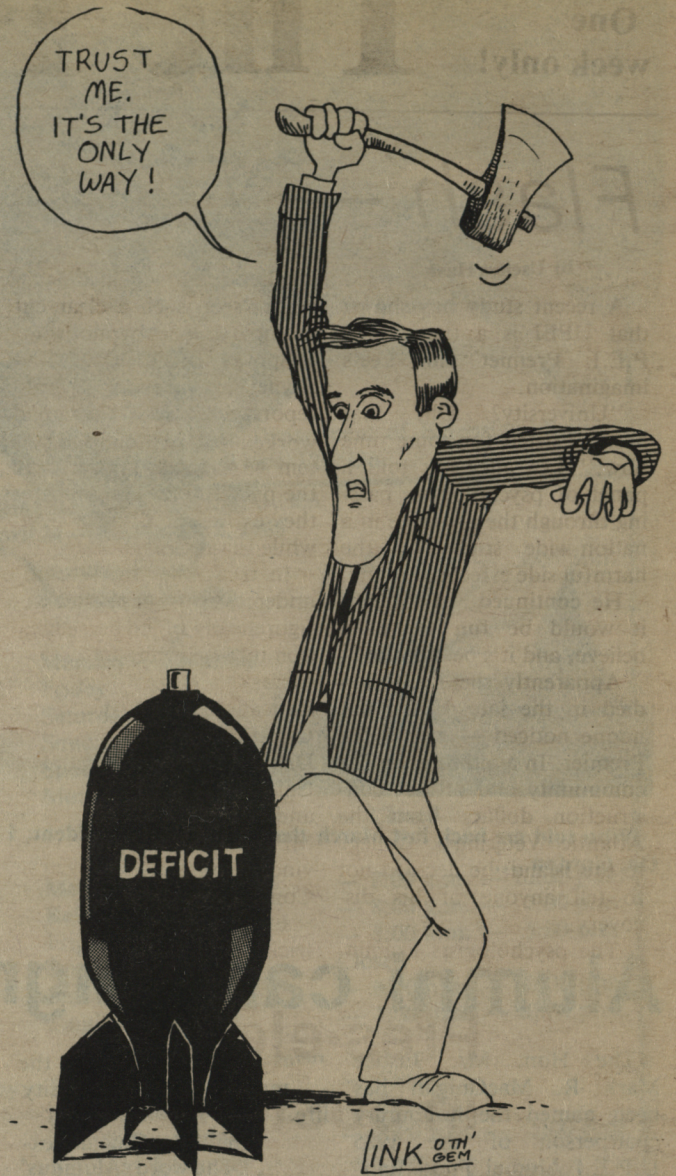
I've been the editor of your student newspaper for a year and a half now, it's time to move on ... down to the Barn.
