Canadian Dollar Times Cost Shown In Payments Deficit

By DON HAMBRIGHT OTTAWA (CP)—The price that Canada must pay for food times was tallied in the official report on the payments deficit by foreigners with Canada. This deficit was \$29,000,000 higher than a year earlier. The extra cash cost is the only reason for this increase. The balance of trade, which compares the estimate, cited these other factors: The figure was 40 per cent higher than the \$100 million deficit of \$23,000,000 in the first quarter of last year, and more than triple the \$100,000,000 shortfall of last October-December.

The underlying reason is that Canadians have more money to spend. This means more demand for imported goods and these imports have sapped the strength from recent gains in exports, inflated partly by the Russian wheat pact. For example, exports to the United States climbed seven per cent in the first quarter of this year. But imports rose even faster, by 19 per cent. In world wide merchandise trade, Canada still had a \$44,000,000 surplus last year, compared with a deficit of \$100,000,000 this year. CANADIANS SPEND MORE. 1960 Reported High Point For P.E.I. Net Farm Income

By FARMER TISSINGTON Capital Budget The Guardian OTTAWA — The year 1960 set a high point in total net income for P.E.I. farm land farmers, a return noted in the Commons recently. In that year, according to provincial figures, the total gross income for P.E.I. agriculture was \$33,420,000 and the operating costs and depreciation came to \$20,000,000 net income at \$13,355,000. This was almost twice the amount the net income has been in the past three years. In 1961, total gross income was \$27,000,000, operating costs and depreciation came to \$21,463,000 leaving a total net income of \$5,537,000. The comparable 1962 figures were: \$28,594,000 gross, \$21,000,000 costs, and \$8,594,000 net income. For 1963, P.E.I. farmers had gross income of \$29,265,000, operating costs and depreciation came to \$21,463,000 leaving a total net income of \$7,802,000. The figures indicate that for the past three years there has been a small but steady increase in gross income and that operating costs and depreciation have risen as fast or faster than that of income.

Oil Hunt Stated For Grand Banks

TULSA, Okla. (AP) — Pan American Petroleum Corp. said Wednesday it plans to survey this summer on 26,000,000 acres of offshore lands on the Grand Banks of Newfoundland where it holds oil exploration rights. Pan Am, North American producing subsidiary of Standard Oil Co. of Indiana, said it does not intend to begin drilling this year, but will make aerial magnetic and marine seismic surveys.
