### WHAT INTERESTS WOMEN.

A woman discusses in the Montreal Herald the theme, "What is most interesting to women as a whole." She says that love affairs are the most interesting matters to women, and come first as the favorite theme. She continues:—

"Young and old, plain and pretty, married and single, rich and poor, clever and simple, all have an interest in love and lovers, and in the lovers and love affairs of other people as well as their own. Have you not noticed at a sewing meeting, or tea, or small at home, or some equally mild function of the kind, how most of the matrons and maidens prick up their ears when Miss So-and-So and Mr. Somebody's names are coupled together, or that Mrs. Dash is spoken of in the same breath with Mr. Blank? Yes, love is always interesting to women. If we do not find it so we are not in a normal condition.

"After that, I must fain put more in sorrow than in anger, that

dress and fashion come second; then scandal, servants, babies, house-keeping, illnesses, indispositions, amusements, games, fancy work, art, literature and politics, in the order in which I have placed them. Women, of course, must vary very much individually in their tastes, as in everything else, but I am taking the average woman as a guide, and though 'man's love is of man's life a thing apart' to the average woman love is indeed her 'whole existence.'"

### NOTES AND COMMENTS.

PRESIDENT Schurman has announced that the New York State College of Forestry at Cornell University has been asked to send six trained men to work in the forestry bureau of the Philippine Islands. He has also been notified that Filipinos, graduates of colleges in the Islands, are to be sent to Cornell in the near future for a professional training in the same line. The New York State College of Forestry has been in existence only two years, and has, as yet, graduated only one man. They will be found, however, as fast as possible.

REMARKING upon the situation in Newfoundland, The Monetary Times says: "The weakness of Mr. Reid's position is that he is seeking a compromise and that unless he gets it he is checkmated.
