## Newly Organized Potato Producers Hold Meeting

Notice of letters patent for incorporation under the Companies Act of "The Potato Producers Association of Prince Edward Island" appears in the latest issue of the Royal Gazette. The incorporators of the Association are Reuben Large, farmer, Wilmet Valley; Donald G. Anderson, farmer, St. Peters; Heath E. Foster, farmer, Marshfield; Major B. Moase, farmer, Summerside, R.R. 1; Alphonus W. Kelly, farmer, Morell.

The purpose of the newly formed Association, as outlined in the Gazette are to work closely with the Provincial and Federal Departments of Agriculture in furthering the policies that affect the potato

industry. Their program will include education of the producers, advertising, standards of production; prevention and eradication of disease; the furnishing of reports and the proceedings of the corporation, its directors and committees and for these purposes to have power to make all necessary contracts and agreements, subject to the by-laws set out in the memorandum of the agreement on file at the office of the Provincial Secretary.

At a meeting held at the Queen Hotel yesterday, the aims of the Association were outlined. They are to promote, encourage and develop the growing of potatoes in P. E. I. and to promote the potato industry generally. After the county directors have been appointed a meeting of potato producers throughout the province will be held at Charlottetown. One of the requirements for membership in the Association are that the person must grow at least one acre of potatoes. In order to be eligible for the position of director in the organization a producer must grow at

least five acres of potatoes and in no way be associated with the assembling or dealership of potatoes. The provisional directors present for the meeting yesterday report that there has been a good response to the appeal for membership thus far.
