International Airport Is Being Expanded

HOULTON, Me. (AP) — The heads of Maine and New Brunswick government met here Sunday to dedicate a new commercial link between the United States and Canada.

Both Governor Edmund S. Muskie and New Brunswick Premier Hugh John Fleming called for an increase in joint endeavors between the two nations at the dedication of the Houlton International Airport.

The dedication, held in conjunction with a week-long festival observance here, signalled the start of a \$140,000 project to increase the size of the airport, which first came into international use as an airplane ferrying stop during the Second World War.

NO SEPARATION

Muskie told about 2,000 persons from both sides of the border that "we should not allow the existence of boundaries to separate us or to obscure the many possibilities of new development."

"We share a vast continent of tremendous resources—many still uncounted—and ample room for all."

Premier Fleming also spoke of the similarities between Canada and the United States. He said the two countries boast a friendship between neighbors not found elsewhere.

FRIENDLY EXAMPLE

He urged that the friendliness be used as an example for the rest of the world and that both nations work together to help solve world problems.

"Canada needs the United States and the U.S. needs Canada," he said, "just as the world needs us both and we need the rest of the world."

Fashion House Drops Hemline By Five Inches

By NADEANE WALKER. PARIS (AP) — Young Yves Saint-Laurent, the new Christian Dior, set fashion buyers on their ear Wednesday by dropping hem lines a revolutionary five inches — right back to mid-calf.

At first incredulous, some buyers got back their breath in time to say they were "delighted."

One New York fashion editor called the Saint-Laurent "curve" line the first really new thing she's seen in Paris this season — "we had all the rest in the New York collections."

To a man, the other designers — Cardin, Heim, Laroche, Lavin Castillo, Griffe, Maggy Rouff, Balmain, Mata and Goma — have cut skirts off at or about the knee.

Saint-Laurent's lengthening of the hem amounted to the deliberate flinging down of a challenge to buyers.

It's not all a matter of hems. The Dior silhouette, while based on a high waistline like all the others, achieves a new and different shape.

Folded in under the bust, it curves out over the waist and hips, and curves gently in again at mid-calf hem. Fullness is evenly distributed all around the figure, and the effect is something brand-new, though it may owe a bit to the trapeze, the baby doll and even the sack.

Saint-Laurent, who took over last year as head designer at Dior, does agree the other designers are right about black — it's the color of the season.

International Airport Is Being Expanded

HOULTON, Me. (AP) — The heads of Maine and New Brunswick government met here Sunday to dedicate a new commercial link between the United States and Canada.

Both Governor Edmund S. Muskie and New Brunswick Premier Hugh John Fleming called for an increase in joint endeavors between the two nations at the dedication of the Houlton International Airport.

The dedication, held in conjunction with a week-long festival observance here, signalled the start of a \$140,000 project to increase the size of the airport, which first came into international use as an airplane ferrying stop during the Second World War.

NO SEPARATION

Muskie told about 2,000 persons from both sides of the border that "we should not allow the existence of boundaries to separate us or to obscure the many possibilities of new development."

"We share a vast continent of tremendous resources—many still uncounted—and ample room for all."

Premier Fleming also spoke of the similarities between Canada and the United States. He said the two countries boast a friendship between neighbors not found elsewhere.

FRIENDLY EXAMPLE

He urged that the friendliness be used as an example for the rest of the world and that both nations work together to help solve world problems.

"Canada needs the United States and the U.S. needs Canada," he said, "just as the world needs us both and we need the rest of the world."
