# Canadian Owned Firm Celebrating Anniversary

W.H. Schwartz and Sons Ltd. is celebrating its 125th anniversary as a part of the Maritime business world, this week. Schwartz and Sons was a family business when it was founded in 1841 and remains a family business today. It is Canada's oldest coffee and spice house. It is one of the few major food businesses in Canada that are still completely Canadian owned and operated.

What began in 1841 as a hand-operated coffee roaster located in a shed at the rear of the family home in Halifax, has expanded into a major concern with plants in Nova Scotia and Quebec.

Expansion has always been part of the company's policy and plans are now well advanced for a new plant to more adequately service the demands of the Atlantic area. This new plant will replace the two Schwartz factories currently in operation in Halifax.

As well as serving Canada, the company also exports to England. This was a market before World War II but overseas sales were stopped at the outset of the war. Now, sales in the British market are firmly re-established and are steadily growing to sizeable proportions.
