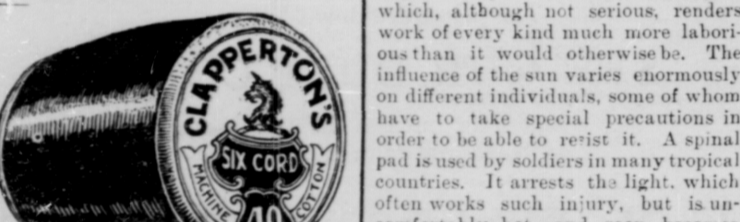

TWO MILLS A MINUTE

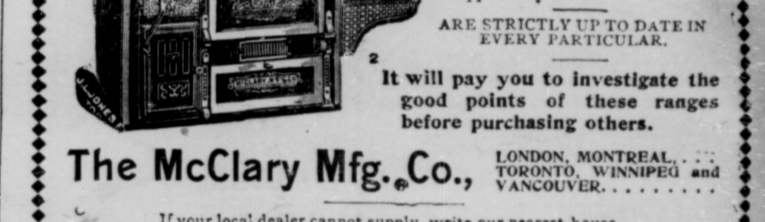
