Busy Session Held In Alberton Court

ALBERTON — John James Nelligan of Norway, near Tignish, was fined \$100 and costs by Magistrate W. Chester S. MacDonald at Alberton Wednesday afternoon on a second conviction of driving while his license was suspended. Nelligan entered a plea of not guilty to a third charge of driving while his license was suspended and the case was adjourned to Nov. 23.

Albert James Wallace, Coleman, was fined \$75 and costs for having care and control of a motor vehicle while impaired. Calvin Harvey Jelley, O'Leary received a similar fine for driving while impaired.

A Bloomfield youth, charged with making application for a liquor permit while under the age of twenty-one, had his case adjourned for one week.

For operating a vehicle without sufficient braking equipment, Keith Ernest Harvey, Enmore, was fined \$20 and costs.

Kenneth Earle Wells, Casumpec and Wayne Glendon Pedersen, Tignish, were each fined \$10 and costs for tire squealing.

George R. Arsenault, Tignish, was fined \$10 and costs for exceeding the speed limit in a forty mile zone and John James Perry, Tignish, received a \$10 fine for failing to stop at an intersection.

Gerald Wayne Gavin, Tignish, was given a warning for having more than two adults exclusive of the driver in the front seat of a vehicle.

Gary James Collicutt, O'Leary and Earle C. Coughlin, Howland, received fines of \$10 and costs for driving without due care and attention.

For operating without a proper muffler, Dale Elwood Collicutt, O'Leary, was fined \$10 and costs.

John Irving Gallant, Howland, was fined \$10 and costs for failing to use the lower or passing beam when meeting traffic.

Joseph Roy Ellsworth, St. Louis, John Leo Butler and Everett Joseph Wedge of Miminegash, all entered pleas of not guilty to charges of loitering or prowling on Halowe'en night and the cases were adjourned to Nov. 30.

Safety Clinic Files Suit

NEW YORK (AP) — Ralph Nader, auto safety critic, has filed a \$25,000,000 suit against General Motors Corp. and others, claiming violation of his privacy.

In the action filed in Manhattan Supreme Court, Nader said that the defendants violated his right of privacy and did "subject him to harassment and intimidation and intrude into and invade his seclusion, solitude and private affairs."

The complain also named as defendants Vincent Gillen, the Vincent Gillen Associates Inc. and Fidelityfacts, Inc.

Nader said that General Motors, when it learned of the imminent publication of his book, "Unsafe At Any Speed," decided to conduct a campaign of intimidating, smearing and otherwise severely injuring "him."

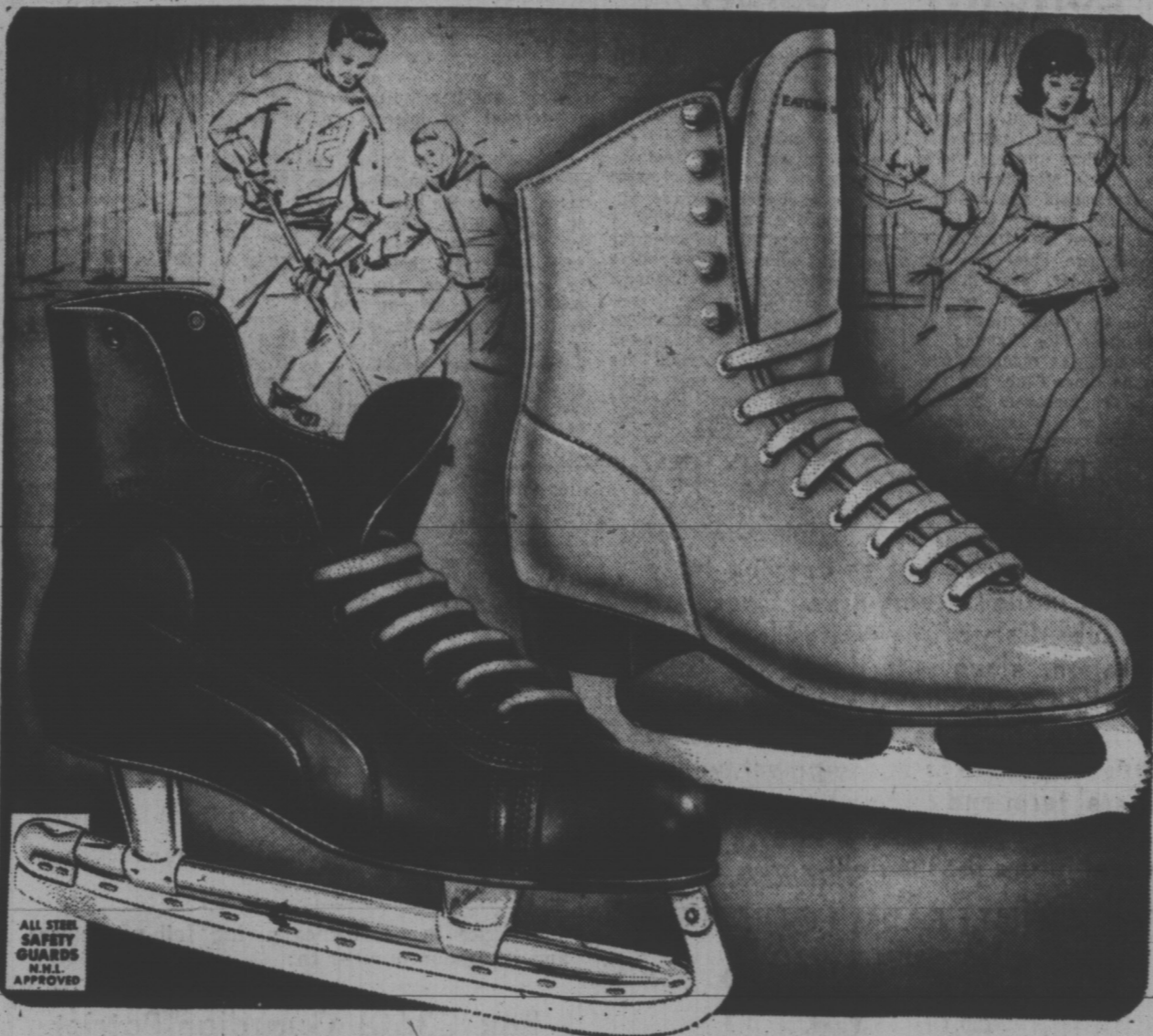

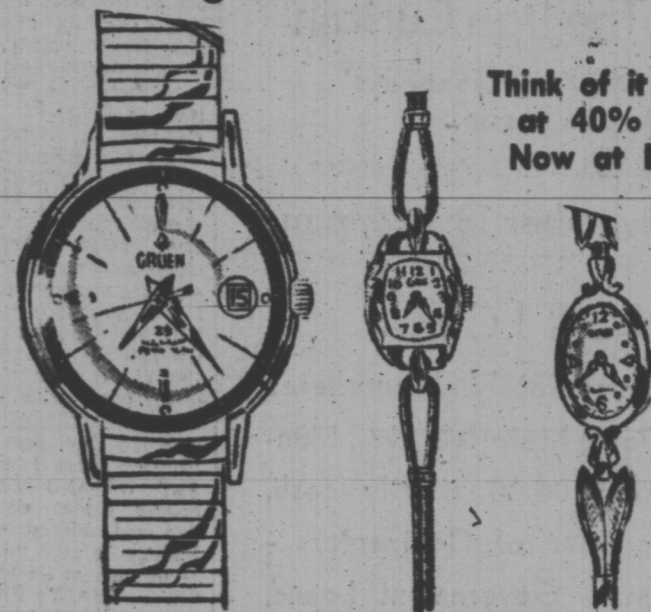
