ST. LAWRENCE CANALS.

SAULT Ste. MARIE CANAL.

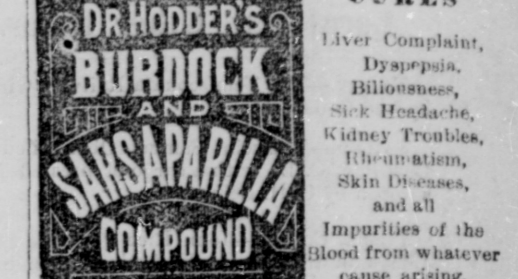
