LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP)—Sir Gaylord and Ridan are drawing additional support by the hour as the clock ticks away toward the 88th Kentucky Derby. Nevertheless, there are 15 rival owners and trainers ready to make the two big colts earn their way into the winner's circle.

Long Shot Cops Free Handicap

NEWMARKET, England (CP)—When Privy Councillor won the Free Handicap here last month, racing fans couldn't have been watching too closely.

They gave the chestnut colt only a 100-to-6 chance of capturing Wednesday's Two Thousand and Guineas Stakes, the one-mile race for three-year-olds which pried off the lid of the British flat racing season. But Privy Councillor took the lead four furlongs from home and won the 15th running of the Two Thousand Guineas by three lengths to give his owner, Maj. Gaerid Glover, a purse of £32,839, biggest in the history of the race.

The winning time was 1:38.74. American-owned Komulus, an 8-to-1 shot, was second, two lengths ahead of Prince Poppa, an Irish entry which started at 100-to-8. Prince Poppa just nipped another Irish mount, Clear Sound, in a photo for third. The Queens Jockey, Henry Carr, was aboard Prince Poppa, which is owned by Lady Sassoon.



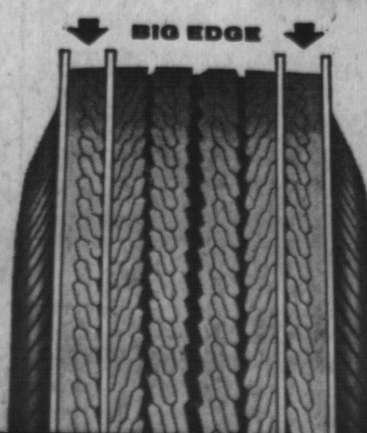
