Canada-wide observation of the week, during which motorists and pedestrians are urged to use extreme caution and courtesy when using streets and highways, will continue through Dec. 7.

This particular week was chosen, said Mr. Gallant, because it is considered one of the most dangerous periods of the year. Motorists especially, who are accustomed to summer and early fall driving, suddenly find themselves faced with early winter driving conditions, such as slippery pavement, wet leaves, ice and snow and reduced visibility through early darkness or fogged-up windshields.

MODERN CANADIAN MINESWEEPERS

Somewhat obscured in the public eye by the RCN's dashing destroyer escorts are these modern wood and aluminum ships of the First Canadian Minesweeping Squadron, based at Halifax, N.S. The squadron was formed six years ago and the 380-ton, 152-foot ships with their vital but monotonous role have ranged up and down the eastern seaboard of Canada and the USA in the course of national and NATO exercises.

Built by Canadian shipyards for the RCN they differ radically from Second World War "sweepers. Of the 20 constructed, six were handed over to France and four to Turkey under the Mutual Aid agreement of NATO.
