Conference Discussions On Financial Arrangements

The big news in Ottawa last week was the Dominion Provincial Conference. Held in the Hall, was a formidable array of political talent with the Premiers of the provinces and the members of Parliament, the press, radio and TV representatives who packed the large room. Prime Minister Diefenbaker was flanked by members of his cabinet directly involved in the Conference along with their advisors. The Prime Minister in his opening address stressed that there would be a new outlook and a different approach to the whole problem of fiscal relations between the federal and provincial governments with a view to a fairer distribution of the tax dollar and special consideration being given to the needy provinces. This is a welcome departure from the attitude of the past government which made its payments on a strict formula based on the population of the province and its share of the Gross National Product.
