THOMAS LEIGH WARREN Thomas Leigh Warren, a well-known farmer of the North Rustico district, passed away suddenly at his home Sunday, May 31st, aged 67 years.

The son of Thomas Archibald Warren and the former Sarah Harris Houston, Mr. Warren was raised on his father's farm, and following his marriage to the former Eva Mae Dickieson in 1916 he continued to farm extensively until five years ago when owing to ill-health he was forced to curtail farming. He spent the past six winters with his family in Ottawa, Ontario, returning each Spring to his home in North Rustico.

Well liked and respected by those who knew him, Mr. Warren took an active part in all phases of community life. He was a member of many years and former deacon of the New Glasgow Christian Church. He was for many years a trustee of the North Rustico School district. While he never ran for public office, he participated in politics in Queens County and maintained a lively interest in political affairs throughout his life.

A devoted family man, Mr. Warren is survived by his wife, three daughters, Mrs. C.S. Roy (Doris) Mrs. J.E. Brydon (Vera) and Mrs. Claude Seguin (Joyce); two sons, Colin A. and S. Shelton; two sisters Mrs. C.H. Campbell (Carolyn) and Ora J.; and six grandchildren all of whom reside in Ottawa.

The funeral services which were very largely attended were held from his residence and conducted by Rev. Merle Zimmerman assisted by Rev. Paul Richardson and Rev. Bryer Jones. The hymns sung were "Peace Perfect Peace" and "The Lord's My Shepherd". Mr. Eric MacGregor, a long time friend of the family, sang as a solo "The Last Mile of the Way".

The many and beautiful floral tributes bore silent testimony in which the deceased was held.

Interment was in the family plot at New Glasgow Cemetery.
