There is quite an agitation in Boston concerning the death sentence imposed on Mrs. Lena Cusumand, recently convicted of the murder of her husband and for which she is to pay the penalty in the electric chair if the influences now at work fail in their purpose of preventing the first execution of a woman in Massachusetts state. For years the opponents of the death penalty in this State have been fighting before the Legislature for its abolition. Now that a woman faces death in the chair the opponents of the death penalty feel that public sentiment is opposed to executing a woman, and that this public sentiment should be crystallized into a formal protest. As a result, this mass meeting, to be held in Faneuil Hall on Saturday night, has been called. A mass meeting will be held in Faneuil Hall tonight at which many prominent men will speak. Among those who are advocating commutation of the sentence is a large number of clergymen including Rev. W. H. Van Allen, rector of the Church of the Advent, who preached in St. Peter's Cathedral and St. Paul's Church, Charlottetown, over a year ago.
