Junior Tourney Starts Today

The Charlottetown junior tennis tournament, under the supervision of the local recreation department, is scheduled to swing into action this morning, at Victoria Park.

The three clay courts are in excellent condition and tennis participation has been much better than anticipated at the beginning of the season.

The city tournament will be concluded Wednesday and the top two competitors from the respective divisions will represent Charlottetown in the provincial tournament.

We were in Summerside during Lobster Carnival Week and had occasion to chat with Miss Janet MacFarlane, who takes care of the tennis program for the youngsters in the western centre.

Janet told us she has approximately 90 youngsters taking part in the tennis program and that she expects to have a healthy entry in the provincial junior competition.

Two years ago you could drive by the Summerside tennis courts at Queen Elizabeth Park and they would be vacant at practically any time you wished to pass by and the enthusiasm for this sport in the capital city was in a similar state of affairs at that time.

This summer there are 130 youngsters registered at the local courts. Although the senior program is still practically nil there are a few taking part and with so many youngsters showing an interest the future appears bright for Island tennis.

Tennis professional, George Mansfield, will be instructing at the Charlottetown courts Thursday, Friday and Saturday of this week.

Everyone is welcome to attend the instructional classes that Mr. Mansfield will conduct. Those planning to attend are urged to bring their own rackets and sneakers to the sessions.

W. Bradley went two for three in a losing cause. Plate umpire was Charlie Ryan.

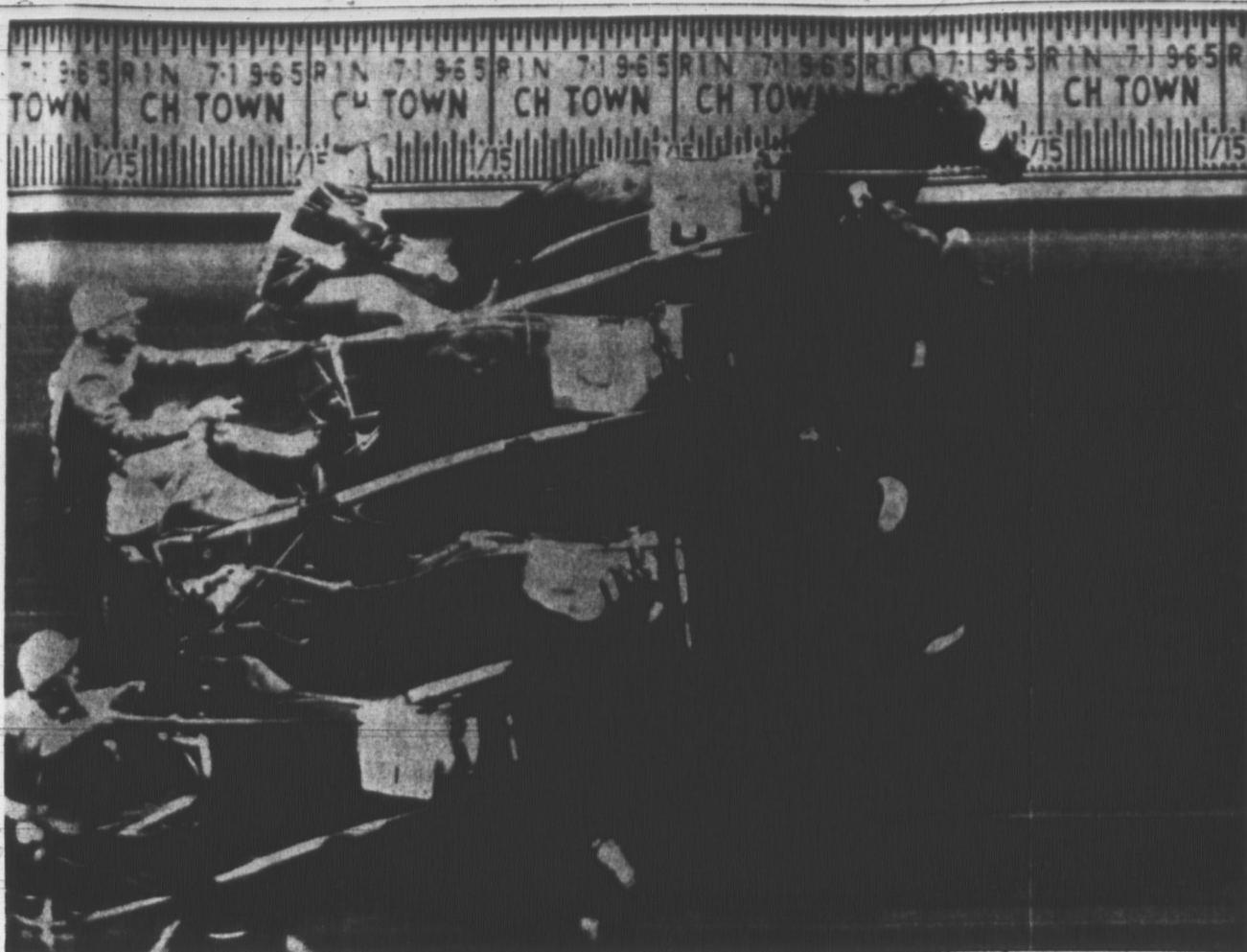

Two Double Dash Winners At Charlottetown Races

Two double dash winners highlighted a thrilling nine dash racing card at the Charlottetown Driving Park last evening. In the second and fifth Am Castle owned by C. D. Jenkins of Southport and teamed by Don MacNeill had a bit too much steam for the field down the backstretch. Times for the two miles, on a track made heavy by showers during the programme were 2:14 and 2:15.

In the fourth and eighth dashes White Lady with Lorne Hennessey holding the ribbons outstrode the field to the wire in two thrilling races. The brown mare won on the photo in the eighth dash in a time of 2:12. Owner of the horse is Simmac Stables.

The first daily double paid \$3.20 when Mystery Mite won the first dash in a photo finish, and Am Castle took the second dash. Johnny Seares Leads Tourney

FREDERICTON (CP) — John Seares of Edmundston returned to the scene of his greatest triumph Monday and pointed himself at a repeat performance of his 1960 showing.

The long hitting six-time Willingdon cup team member shot a brilliant one-under par 69 over the Fredericton golf club to take a three-stroke lead in the New Brunswick — Prince Edwards Island amateur golf tournament. The final two rounds of the 54-hole meet will be played today and Wednesday over the Fredericton course.

Seares holds a three-stroke lead over Pierre Rossignol of the Gowan Brae golf and country club in Bathurst and Doug MacAfee of the Sussex golf club. Both Rossignol and MacAfee are juniors and strong threats to land berths on the N.B.-P.E.I. junior team and the N.B.-P.E.I. Willingdon Cup team.

Low scores and fine golf marked the first day of the meet as a record number of scores under 80 were turned in. There were 55 golfers in the first three divisions under 80 including 29 from the second and third division where some of the meet's early leaders blossomed forth.

A heavy rain during the night and early morning turned the course into top condition with s'ow greens the only complaint of most of the shotmakers.

Following the top three in the tourney standings were four players tied with 73's including two in the second division. They were Frank MacInnes and

John Irwin of the Belvedere golf and winter club in Charlottetown, Don Myles Jr. of the Westfield golf and country club and Grant Forbes of the Edmundston Golf club. Irwin and Myles are playing in the second division.

Pitcher Warren Spahn Is Picked Up By Giants

By JACK STEVENSON Associated Press Sports Writer SAN FRANCISCO (AP) —Warren Spahn, the 44-year-old former pitching star who was cut loose by the last place New York Mets, will join the pennant-contending San Francisco Giants Wednesday.

The Giants announced Monday they had reached an agreement with the veteran who has won more games than any other left-hander in baseball history. The high-salaried hurler was released last Wednesday by the youth-minded Mets.

Although Spahn had lost eight straight for the last place Mets, both he and the Giants feel he'll help the third-place club in its drive for the National League pennant.

Terms of the contract weren't announced, but it was believed the veteran won't suffer much of a cut from the \$73,500 he signed for with the Mets.

Baseball contracts are based on a 3 1/2 month season and the Mets in releasing him were releasing to pay one month's salary. The Giants are expected to give him about \$18,000 for the rest of the campaign.

FILLS SLOT

Manager Herman Franks said he feels the left-hander can help and he has been searching for a portside thrower. The Giants have only two, Bill Henry and Masanori Murakami, neither of them starters.

"I may start him," Franks said. "I just don't know yet how he'll be used. We'll talk as soon as he gets here."

In New York, Spahn said he planned to arrive in San Francisco on Wednesday. When he gets here, the Giants must cut one player to stay within the 25-player limit.
