Speaker Rejects Attempt For Steel Prices Debate

OTTAWA (CP)—Speaker Alan Macnaughton turned down an attempt by New Democrat Leader Douglas to set aside regular Commons business for an emergency debate on steel price increases.

Discussion of the motion by the NDP leader took up almost an hour at the start of the sitting before Mr. Macnaughton ruled the matter, although important, did not meet the test of an urgent need for debate as stipulated in the Commons rules.

Mr. Douglas maintained the price increase announced by the Steel Company of Canada is unjustified and said it would touch off an inflationary spiral.

Opposition Leader Dielenbaker said Canada has inflation "not galloping but very close to it." If the Speaker ruled against adjournment of the day's business for a debate on steel prices then Prime Minister Pearson should set aside a day for such a debate as soon as possible.

Answering a question by Mr. Douglas later Mr. Pearson said there would be an opportunity at the beginning of the new session He also would give consideration to making a statement on the subject.

Last week he said the government has no plans to interfere with the announced increase of \$5 to \$7 a ton for steel but would keep the situation under review.

Mr. Douglas said the steel price increase would have wide-ranging effects on the economy. It would result in an upswing in the cost of living because of the impact on prices of cars, trucks, farm implements, appliances and tools. "Every housewife will feel it."

Concern had been expressed about the rise by such bodies

as the National Farmers Union and by President Claude Jodoin of the Canadian Labor Congress and William Mahoney, national director of the United Steelworkers of America (USW).

But the steel increase was serious and the government had been totally negligent about taking the people into its confidence.

Mr. Dielenbaker said the increase would have tremendous inflationary results and would erode the earnings of Canadians.

H. A. Olson (SC—Medicine Hat) said the matter is important to all Canadians but what result would come from an adjournment to discuss the matter? The government could not tell the companies to roll back prices.

The House had been subjected to abuse of the rules through many attempts to call for emergency debates.

U.S. Economy Moves Ahead

WASHINGTON (AP)—Commerce Secretary John T. Connor said here the American economy is moving ahead briskly with massive production of steel and automobiles overshadowing some weakness in housing construction.

He said businessmen have greatly increased their allocations for plant and equipment expenditures this year, according to a recently completed survey.

The survey, he said, shows that businessmen plan to raise their spending by 12 to 14 per cent over last year compared with the eight-per cent increase reported in a government survey several months ago.

Connor added that the U.S. treasury's recent relaxing of depreciation rules, expected to save corporations \$700,000,000 in taxes, should have a further stimulating effect on the expansion plans of businessmen.

You don't look a gift horse in the mouth, even when it comes to you at the table on a silver platter. You take it, say thank you to the opponents, and go on to the next deal, having taken fullest advantage of the gift.

Boris Schapiro, British star, was declarer at four spades in this hand from a match between France and Great Britain. Four spades could have been defeated in several different ways, but the defense had no sure guide line to follow and chose the one course that gave Schapiro a chance to make the contract.

Of course, if West had had the king of clubs, this method of play would have failed. In that case, the simpler method of leading a low club towards the queen would have done the job. But Schapiro knew from the bidding that East had the king of clubs. West would not have opened with a preemptive bid, holding seven good hearts, the ace of diamonds, and the king of clubs as well. With such a hand he would certainly have line to follow and chose the one course that gave Schapiro a chance to make the contract.
