hattery plant and a photo-finishing shop would provide about more jobs.

But "one-quarter the money spent on these new industries would have given us a new mill and would have employed three times as many men."

N. 2 colliery, where Mr. Gilroy still works as a security guard is being dismantled. Former miners are "depressed" and "fed up," he said.

Mr. Gilroy said an independent group, whom he declined to identify, were interested in tapping this area's estimated 2,000,000 tons of coal.

There was demand in the immediate marketing area and Moncton and Saint John, N.B. & Springhill coal. No coal has been produced here since the parent Dominion Steel and Coal Corporation decided to close No. 2 colliery. It has been sealed with concrete.

Mr. Gilroy estimated it would cost \$100,000 to open a new mill. There are about a dozen enterprises on the Dosco — payers here. These include a five-man railway crew, three security guards and a surface foreman.

Mr. Gilroy, 56, has been may through the town's major disasters since 1953. Thirty-nine coal miners were killed in a mine explosion November of that year. A fire wiped out part of the town's principal money and interest secured thereby.

Coal Wanted At Springhill By IAN DONALDSON Canadian Press Staff Writer SPRINGHILL, N. S. (CP) Mayor Ralph Gilroy, whose creditors discovered coal in the hard-luck town, said here Thursday coal remains the answer this area's economic problems.
