Tip That Luke Sewell To Pitts.

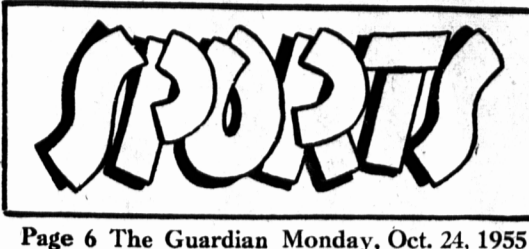
