

# Construction Association Expands Education Programs

Today at the Construction Centre of PEI, construction association general manager Francis Reid announced the implementation of a new Management Telecourse, to be made available to association members and to the general public. The course is entitled "The Business of Management" and its format is a series of twenty-six lessons to be presented in half hour segments through Island Cablevision.

"Our Association has always been committed to continuing education" stated Mr. Reid, "but what is exciting about this course, besides quality, is that it will be more easily accessible to people. After work its easier to come home and watch TV than to enroll in a night course. This allows people to do both." In addition to being shown on cablevision, the program is also available on video cassette at the

Holland College Resource Centers in Charlottetown, Summerside, Elmsdale, and Souris.

Management is often thought of as something confined to boardrooms and head offices. Simply defined, however, management is getting things done through people, a task most of us face very day, both on the job and at home.

Mr. Reid states that, "The business of management is de-

signed for the managerial candidate who is newly graduated or the person who has worked but has no formal training in business management." "Information from the Southern California Consortium, the producers of the telecourse, states "The course is intended to provide essential skills in planning and organizing, staffing and directing controlling, decision making, motivation, communicating, and applying managerial skills to the business organization."

Holland College and the Prince Edward Island Department of Industry are also sponsoring the course. Mr. Dale Landry, the President of the College, states simply that, "We're pleased to be a part of this program... we want to work together with industry to make quality education accessible."

## Officer Bob Contest

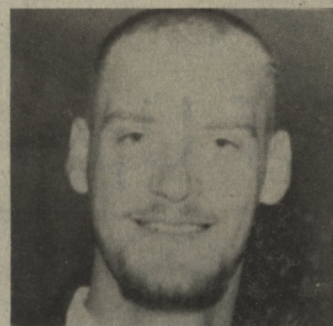
